**THREE THOUGHTS:**

**THOUGHT #1:** The \_\_\_\_\_ Behind the Process

**Romans 8:29 (NIV)** “For those God foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the image of his Son, that he might be the firstborn among many brothers and sisters.”

**THOUGHT #2:** The Peace That Is Meant to \_\_\_\_\_

**Colossians 3:15 (NIV)** “Let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts.”

**THOUGHT #3:** The Rest That \_\_\_\_\_

**Hebrews 4:9–10 (NIV)** “There remains, then, a Sabbath-rest for the people of God; 10 for anyone who enters God’s rest also rests from their works, just as God did from his.”

**TALK IT OVER**

1. Romans 8:29 reminds us that God’s goal is Christlikeness, not performance. Where do you feel most tempted to *strive* spiritually instead of trusting God’s forming work—and what might it look like to cooperate with the process rather than control it?
2. Colossians 3:15 says the peace of Christ is meant to “rule” our hearts. What signs help you recognize when Christ’s peace is ruling in your life—and what usually disrupts that peace for you?
3. Hebrews 4 speaks of a rest that remains for God’s people. In this season of your life, what would it look like to truly “rest from your works” and live from surrendered trust instead of constant effort?
