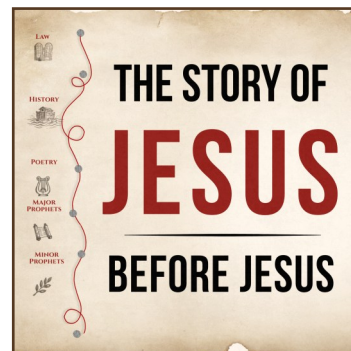
Women's Brunch– September 12th
