Parents Guide

Family Time: "Jesus Sees Me"
Luke 19:1–10

Big Truth
Jesus came to seek and save sinners.

Main Point
Jesus knew Zacchaeus by name before Zacchaeus ever climbed down the tree. Jesus sees us, knows us, loves us, and calls us to follow Him.

Read Together:

Read Luke 19:1–10 together.

If your child is younger, read slowly and stop to ask:

- Who wanted to see Jesus?
- Why couldn't Zacchaeus see?
- What did Jesus say?
- What changed after Zacchaeus met Jesus?

Family Activity

"Can You See It?"

Hide a small object somewhere in the room.

Give your child clues until they find it.

After they find it, ask:

"How did it feel when you finally found it?"

Then explain:

"Jesus wasn't looking for Zacchaeus because He had lost him. Jesus was intentionally seeking him because He loved him. Jesus came to seek and save people who are separated from God by sin."

Read Luke 19:10 again.
