Welcome One Another As Christ Has Welcomed You (Romans 15:1-7)

When all a church has in common is Christ, and yet it loves and welcomes one another in Christ, God looks supremely glorious.

The **Basis** of Unity

The basis of the church's unity is the gospel. We must welcome one another as God has welcomed us (15:7). So how has God welcomed us?

- God has welcomed us by grace He chose us by grace (11:5-6), justified us by grace (3:23-24), and keeps us by grace (5:2).
- God has welcomed us through faith not because we are righteous, or try our best to be righteous, or promise to be righteous, but only because we trust in the righteousness of Christ (1:16-17; 3:21-22; 4:4-5; 5:1).
- God has welcomed us in Christ because of His perfect life and atoning death (3:23-26; 5:18-19).

Therefore our welcome of one another must be by grace, through faith, in Christ.

The **Means** of Unity

How do we actively pursue and maintain gospel-centered unity in the face of so many potential disruptions?

- By forgoing our freedom for the sake of the weak (15:1).
- By following the way of Christ (15:2-3).
- By feeding upon the Word of God (15:4-5).

The **Aim** of Unity

The ultimate goal of unity is the glory of God. And God is most glorified when a people with nothing in common but Christ love and welcome one another.
