

· They have moved into their home.

• Their goal of the summer is to start attending events, serving where they can, and start integrating and becoming a part of the community and building relationships.

Our church went out there June 24-28. They worked on the building, focusing mainly on the outside getting it looking nice.
They have set a remodeling budget for the church building at \$20,000 and have funded around a 1/4 of this. They are praying for God's provision for the remaining funds needed to update the inside, along with a realistic timeline and volunteers to complete the projects.

• There are some health concerns with Elisabeth and Henry, but all tests have come back clean for preeclampsia and Henry continues to grow and looks healthy on all the follow up ultrasounds, he just continues to measure small.

• They are also praying for provision and wisdom with our personal finances. The two biggest issues are paying doctors bill and purchasing a 2nd vehicle that can hold a family of 6 and has 4WD.




