
WELCOME!

LOOKING FORWARD



As we prepare for our upcoming Episcopal Visitation from The Rt. Rev. Frank Brookhart on Sunday, December 7, 2025, Rev. Christopher will be leading a 10-session class beginning on Sunday, August 17 2025 at 9AM in The Lounge. Classes will continue every other Sunday through November 30th with two back-to-back sessions in September. The last class will be on the Saturday before the Bishop's visit. The specific dates are: 8/31, 9/14, 9/21 (11:30am),10/5, 10/19, 11/2, 11/16, 11/30 at 9AM & Saturday 12/6 @ 10AM. Education for Ministry (EfM) is celebrating 50 years of service to God and the Church! With its recent revisions, EfM moves from being text-based to a new, redesigned multi-media program with a new twist.

EfM: Classic remains the traditional four-year group program in which registrants commit to studying one year at a time for 36 weeks (Sept.-June), beginning with the Old Testament.


EfM: Wide Angle is a new offering inviting you to "taste of four years of EfM in one year," experiencing an introduction to scripture (both OT & NT), Christian history, spiritual practices, ethics, and theological reflection in a 36-week program. Wide Angle registrants will meet simultaneously with our Classic group on campus, Wednesday evenings from 6:30 to 9.

Wide Angle may be taken by anyone, including former EfM graduates, people with no experience in the EfM program, or by anyone who feels they need a break from "EfM: Classic", regardless of what years were previously taken.

Participants in both Wide Angle & Classic are represented in all discussions and reading assignments.
