

This month's spotlight is our Associate Pastor of Worship, Mark Abbott. The congregation sees Mark lead a few congregational songs, a choir anthem, and sing a special as a solo, duet, or with the quartet. I bet he wishes that is all he did. Here is a look behind the scenes of a typical week and responsibilities for brother Mark.

- 1. Mark directs and plans the music for the Adult Choir, Aiken Baptist Associational Choir, Handbells, Proclaim (youth), and works with Dawn and her team in Kids Choir.
- 2. Planning the music must be done months in advance. Mark spends hours listening to music, picking the songs, musicals, and anthems, ordering the digital copy of the music, marking and making copies for each choir, each choir member, the musicians, and placing them in the appropriate notebook.
- 3. Prepares for rehearsals for each of these choirs each week.
- 4. Plans the music and order of worship each week for both the am and pm services. This must be done every week whether he is in town or on vacation.
- 5. Enters all the words to the songs, order of service, Pastor's power point into the computer.
- 6. Plans for Adult Christmas, Easter, and special holiday musicals.
- 7. Works with Dawn in choosing the Kid's Musicals for Christmas and Spring.
- 8. Mark also sings for funerals for Sweetwater members as well as for those in the community as well.
- 9. He visits choir/church members at home, hospitals and assisted living facilities.
- 10. He directs our Right Now Media Subscription A video discipleship ministry for all ages.
- 11. Works alongside Bill Little helping with the Audio/Video ministry of the church.
- 12. Serves as the unofficial IT guy for the church office.
- 13. Runs sound for special events and groups.
- 14. Helps with Joyous Seniors each month by setting up and running sound and even helping in the kitchen when needed.
- 15. Serves as the Aiken Baptist Associational Music Director directing a senior adult/retiree choir in the Fall and Spring each year.
- 16. Served this summer as one of the South Carolina Baptist Convention Summer Regional Coordinators for the State Music Department seeking to help build relationships among music ministers throughout his designated region of Aiken, Edisto, Edgefield, & Ridge Associations.
- 17. Works with Posey Funeral Directors in facilitating our GriefShare Program here at Sweetwater ministering to the needs of those who are experiencing grief and loss.
- 18. Working on finishing up his Doctor of Ministry at Knox Theological Seminary.

NOTE: Mark has the toughest job of all of us. There are over 400 people who attend Sweetwater which means there are over 400 different tastes of music and opinions of what kind of music that needs to be played. No matter what he chooses there will be people that do not like it. He is in a no-win situation. Remember, he leads us to worship King Jesus.

I am sure that I have left something off his busy schedule and things to do list. I do hope this will give you an idea of what he does. Make sure you give Mark a BIG thanks for what he does when you see him.


Music Moments with Mark






