
Music Moments with Mark

Dear Church Family,

Sometimes in our lives we face things that we never saw coming. There are moments when our faith is shaken by things that are outside of our control. It is in these valley experiences that we must follow the words of Proverbs 3:5-6: "Trust in the LORD with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to Him, and He will make your paths straight." It would be easy to believe the false truth that perception is reality. Sometimes things we perceive to be true aren't true at all. The world would say trust your heart, however, that isn't what God's Word says. The Bible says in Jeremiah 17:10, "The heart is deceitful above all things, and desperately wicked; who can know it?" So how do we move forward on this journey called life if we can't trust our own heart. Well, we need to turn to someone that does know the heart. We do what Jeremiah 17:11 says, "I the LORD search the heart and test the mind, to give every man according to his ways, according to the fruit of his deeds". - Floors are swept, moped and vacuumed

- Pens, welcome/visitor cards are refilled, Bibles and Hymn books are straightened up and candy wrappers are dug out of the Lord's Supper Cup holders and in the cracks of the pews.

- Exterior Doors are wiped down and cleaned
- Rugs are vacuumed
- Windows are washed inside and out

- Magazines are put out

Depending on what events are going on or if there is a funeral she cleans before and after to make sure everything is ready and clean for Sunday. I realize I am missing a ton of other things that she does but she is priceless. I have never met anyone that takes more pride in her work than she does. Most people do not appreciate the work that goes into keeping a place this size clean. It is also very easy to overlook what takes place behind the scenes until it's not clean. When you see Ginny tell her thank you for her hard work.

Peculiar People: Following Jesus in Uncertain Times








Nursery is also offered on Wednesday evenings during the service and during adult choir practice.


