The Dawning of God's New Day

Advent is a season of light, bringing flickering hope into the darkest time of the year. Its candles remind us of the coming of Jesus as the promised Savior, sent by the Father in the fullness of time, redeeming the long years of waiting. The lamps of our hearts are lit so we might constantly be prepared to welcome his Holy-Spirit-presence into our lives. And we carry the light of hope as the church stands vigil in anticipation of Jesus' second coming, when God's kingdom comes in all its fullness to bring wholeness to the entire creation.

One of the most prominent lights of the story of the birth of Jesus is found in the second chapter of Matthew's gospel. The Bethlehem star was a beacon that broadcast the gospel, the good news of the Messiah's birth, to magi from the east who represented those outside God's covenant with Israel. As they followed God's starlit invitation to offer their worship to the newborn King, it was the dawning of a new day in God's relationship with the world. The Messiah's message is meant for everyone!

'Where is the one who has been born king of the Jews? We saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him.' ... When they saw the star, they were overjoyed! On coming to the house, they saw the child with his mother Mary, and they bowed down and worshipped him. (Mt. 2:2,10-11)

Isaiah foretold this dawning of light for Israel and all the nations (peoples) of the world:

- Nations will come to your light, and kings to the brightness of your dawn. (Isa. 60:3)
- Your light will break forth like the dawn, and your healing will appear. (Isa 58:8)
- The people walking in darkness have seen a great light; on those living in the land of deep darkness a light has dawned. (Isa. 9:2)


We who count ourselves as disciples of Jesus live in the light of the Lord. We are called and commissioned by our Lord to share the light of his "Life, Love, & Hope." The goal of all our activities and investment as a congregation is to see lives transformed by the light of Christ that illumines the darkness. May we not settle for business as usual, but labor only and ever to see lives reclaimed through repentance, God's abundant grace flowing into human lives through divine forgiveness. May our efforts be focused on seeing lives redirected in apprenticeship to Jesus, following him step-by-step, where God's wisdom is applied to life through the Word that is a lamp to our feet and a light for our path.

This Advent, how might we appreciate anew the light of Christ that has dawned on our lives? How might we shine the light of Christ so others will feel the warmth of its life-transforming glow? Is there someone in our lives who God is calling us to reach out to personally with the light of Christ?

May the light of Advent prepare us for the dawning of God's new day. May we hearken with alert interest to the word of God through the prophet Isaiah (43:19, 60:1): "See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? ... Arise, shine, for your light has come!"

Ministry Update:

A Gift of Hope for Lena and Her Daughter

Dear Church Family,

We're happy to share a recent story that shows how your prayers, support, and generosity are making a real difference in people's lives.

Through our outreach ministry, we were able to assist Lena, a 45-year-old single mother who lives with her 17-year-old daughter, Paula, in Kazakhstan. Life has been especially challenging for Lena since she lost her permanent job. She now works part-time at a bakery as a saleswoman, doing her best to make ends meet. Her daughter, Paula, is a college student pursuing her education without a scholarship. While college tuition is free, there are still daily needs and expenses that put extra strain on their limited income.

Lena lost her mother seven years ago and has no remaining family to turn to for help. Despite these hardships, she continues to persevere for her daughter's sake.

Thanks to the continued support of North Creek Presbyterian Church community, we were able to bless Lena and Paula with a food package, along with funds to cover their utility bills for the next three months. Their response was one of sincere gratitude and relief.

Lena was deeply moved and said,

"I feel like Jesus Himself visited us."

This simple yet profound statement reminds us of why we serve — to be a reflection of Christ's love and presence in the lives of those who are struggling. It's moments like these that remind us we are not just meeting physical needs — we are part of God's work in bringing comfort, hope, and light.

We share this not to boast, but to remind us all that the love of Christ is alive and active when we serve one another in practical ways. Every donation and every prayer contributes to these moments of grace.


