The season of Advent begins today, the fourth Sunday before Christmas. The word "Advent" means "coming" or "drawing near." During this season, Christians throughout the world prepare for the anniversary of Christ's first coming through reflection on our yearning for wholeness and salvation. Such reflection can serve to heighten our sense of anticipation for the Christ child's birth, which we will celebrate on Christmas. The Advent seasons reminds us that Christ will come again at the end of time to reign over heaven and earth in majesty.

In 1934, Dean Milner-White (an Anglican priest) created A Procession with Carols on Advent Sunday for use at King's College Chapel basing it on his earlier Lessons and Carols for Christmas. In the preface for this new service, Milner-White wrote: "In the old English liturgies, the Advent Offices made a preparation for the coming of our Lord to this earth far more vivid and eager than those of our present Prayer Book. So an Advent Carol Service, if without precedent, is not without suitability, if it helps to express 'the desire of all nations and ages.'" The purpose of the service is "not to celebrate Christmas, but to expect it."

The main theme of this service is "the development of the loving purposes of God..." seen "through the windows and words of the Bible." May this morning's time of script and song bring you a rich sense of God's love and presence this Advent season.

These prayers and praises let us humbly offer to God, in the words that Christ himself taught us.

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever and ever.
