Pastor's Message

Dear Parish Family,

The prophet Amos, in this weekend's first reading [September 21], shouts out, "Hear this, you who trample upon the needy and destroy the poor of the land!" Amos was calling out and denouncing unjust practices and behaviors by the people towards others. Care and justice for one's neighbor is a firm foundational principle in both the Old and New Testaments, most especially towards the poor, outcast, immigrants, and vulnerable.

Within Catholic social teaching, this firm biblical foundation of care and justice for one's neighbor, most especially the poor, the immigrant, and the vulnerable, forms one of its central principles. Catholic social teaching is composed of seven principles: life and dignity of the human person; call to family, community, and participation; rights and responsibilities; the preferential option for the poor and vulnerable; the dignity of work and the rights of workers; solidarity; and care for God's creation.

Regarding the preferential option for the poor, St. Paul VI reminded us that we all have a responsibility in serving those who suffer the effects of poverty when he wrote: "In teaching us charity, the Gospel instructs us in the preferential respect due to the poor and the special situation they have in society: the more fortunate should renounce some of their rights so as to place their goods more generously at the service of others." (A Call to Action Octogesima Adveniens, 23).

Those who exist at the margins of our communities and society have a special place in the heart of our Lord and His Church, and therefore ought to have a place within each of our hearts as well.


