Kids at Casa

- ~ That they would realize that our rules are out of our love for them, are designed for their well-being, and are not meant to make them feel hemmed in.
- ~ That the judge would make wise decisions during custody hearings

Transitional Program

- ~ Pray for the kids who will soon be leaving Casa and entering the transitional program, that Guatemalan families would step forward to house them as they finish their education.
- ~ That God would guide us in what education or training would be best to prepare them for the future.

Staff

~ That they would continue to reach out lovingly and correct the children well, no matter what attitudes they have to deal with or how often the kids mess up.
