

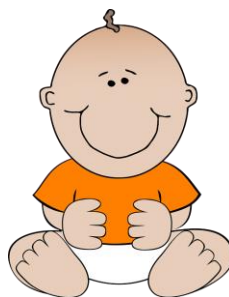
New Hope Kids Wellness Policy

In order to protect the health of the children in our care, New Hope Kids has developed a strict wellness policy. A child exhibiting any of the following symptoms, or appears to be unwell, will not be admitted to their class. By adhering to this policy, we are ensuring that sick children get the care they need at home and that the children in our classrooms, as well as the medically fragile members of our congregation, remain well.

The Committee of Infectious Diseases of the American Academy of Pediatrics recommends a child should not be taken from home when any of the following are present:

Symptoms within the past 24 hours:

- Fever of 99.6 or greater
- Pale/flushed skin color
- Diarrhea, vomiting, complaints of a stomachache
- Watery/red eyes
- Persistent and/or productive cough, Sore throat
- Excessive Sneezing
- Stuffy/runny nose (yellow, green)
- Extreme fatigue/lethargy
- Any symptoms of common childhood diseases, such as chicken pox, strep throat, hand foot and mouth, head lice, pertussis, etc.
