Letter from our Pastor Emeritus

Also, be advised that you should always use good judgment before taking unnecessary risks under any inclement weather conditions.







T. PAUL'S UCC CAR & BIKE SHOW

The Men's Fellowship met on Nov. 20th with eight members present. Don Deeker gave the opening prayer and Paul Freese served as moderator for the meeting. John Buhr read the minutes from the October meeting and Bob Aholt reported a balance of \$35,642. This includes the proceeds from the car show with many outstanding expenses still to be paid.

At the October meeting the Fellowship designated 50% of the car show profit to supporting the church and related activities and 50% to the community. After all expenses have been paid, the Fellowship plans on meeting with the Car Show Committee to receive its suggestions for gifts to community organizations. Don Lange distributed a handout on suggested donations to community organizations to be considered. The purpose was to provide a starting point for discussion. At the proposed meeting, lessons learned from the car show will be discussed with the purpose being how to improve it in years to come.

The Fellowship approved giving a \$100 K & R gift card to Brandon Vedvig for grilling the meat for the food stand at the car show. It also expressed its appreciation for help from the community in removing bushes from the south parking lot and other work. Also discussed was planting new small bushes at the church cemetery sign. This will be referred to the church council. A thank you note from the Bob Dohrer family was read expressing their appreciation to the Fellowship for its memorial donation.




