This Month's Message from Pastor Paul Dunbar

Did any of you grow up in a church where the doors were left intentionally unlocked? I know both urban and rural congregations which made that their policy. I'd love to do a little study sometime, delve into the history of that practice, to see how far back and how widespread the custom was and is. I remember a time when we staff here at Faith would unlock all the doors in the morning, Monday through Friday, and only lock them again at the end of the day. We didn't want the possibility or even the suggestion that God's house was unavailable to someone in need.

Over the years, we had some incidents where people – usually bored or curious neighborhood kids and teenagers, out of school for the summer, looking for some adventure and maybe light mischief – came in and wandered through the building without our knowing, until we were startled by them somewhere in the basement. We'd have a gentle but direct conversation with them, ask what they were doing, see if they needed to use the restroom or drinking fountain, show them our sanctuary, ask if they had a church home, and generally try to make a friend out of them. I like to think we planted some seeds in the process. Unfortunately (and unrelated to the harmless

youngsters and their curiosity,) there were also over the years a couple incidents of break-ins to vehicles in our lot, and a bigger break-in to the building itself a few years back.

Fast-forward to today where our general rule is to have only the west/main doors open on weekdays. It helps us direct visitors and strangers to the office, and allows us to know who is coming and going. I really hope it's not an inconvenience to you, or worse yet, a deterrent to someone who may have finally mustered the courage to come to this house of prayer and refuge for sinners, maybe for the first time in their life, only to tug at a locked door, lose their nerve, and head home. I'm not suggesting a change of policy. We do, after all, live "in the world." But part of me still wishes, even if it feels a bit naive or idealistic, that we could have the church be a place with perpetually open doors.

Regardless, it's good to remember that in Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, we have a God who is perpetually, continuously available. No matter the day, the hour, the person, the need. Hymn #915 in our Lutheran Service Book has grown to become one of my favorites in all hymnody. Verse two says, "Today your gate is open, and all who enter in will find a Father's welcome, and pardon for their sin." Verse three says, "No question will be asked us how often we have come; although we oft have wandered, it is our Father's home." The fourth and final verse perhaps says it best: "O all embracing mercy, O ever-open Door, what should we do without You when heart and eye run o'er? When all things seem against us to drive us to despair, we know one gate is open, one ear will hear our prayer." Amen to that truth and promise!

It's worth adding that I have, I know, in my years as pastor, written and spoken the words, "My door is always open." While it's true that I leave my office door propped open, pretty much 24/7, with a carved wooden bird doorstop, (a gift from Cindy O'Donnell before her retirement,) I admit that I'm not ALWAYS in my office. Sometimes you've come by to visit, hoping to talk, only to learn that I'm out on some personal or work errand. You've called and I've been on the line with someone else. I recently had someone try to leave me a message in my voicemail, only to find my mailbox full (I've since cleared it out!) But I do want to invite you again, if you want to talk, please call or email or text me, and we'll set something up. I love you and you are important


