This Month's Message from Pastor Josh Davis

I've always loved books (if you've been in my office, you probably could have guessed that). From a very young age, I looked forward with eagerness for trips to the library so that I could fill up my book sack with a new stack of reading material. Books taught me about scientific discoveries and historical events; books helped me learn about interesting people and places; books could take me to a different world filled with fantastical creatures and events.

The Bible is more than simply a book – it is the very Word of God, living and active in our lives even today. But we do experience it in book form. In fact, we could say that the Bible is a book full of books – books that teach us the history of God's people; books that tell us about interesting persons and places; books that contain extraordinary visions; but, best of all, books that tell us the Good News of God's love for the world and direct us toward our Savior, Jesus Christ. Reading these books, this Book, actually changes us, because God works in and through His Word. And reading God's Word regularly is a habit worth starting if you haven't already.

I'm excited to share with you a resource that we hope will help you and your kids study the Bible, learn more about it and grow in your walk with Jesus: Our newly redesigned church library. For months, DCE Leah Werling has been working on updating, arranging, and redecorating Vicki Fisher's former office (which is north of the periodical table in the south hallway) to serve as our new church library. On its

shelves you will find Bibles and Bible story books for kids, Bible study helps for those digging deeper, biographies and histories, resources for spiritual growth, topical material to deal with tough issues, and a variety of children's books. We plan to be continually updating the resources available there, so you can come back again and again to see what's new.

For now, we're using the honor system for checkouts. If you take a book with you, please sign your name in the binder that sits on the table in that room. Then, when you return the book so someone else can use and appreciate it, you can mark "returned" in that same binder. I hope you'll get the chance to check out the library — it is a lovely place to sit and read in a quiet corner of our building. And if you have questions about the process, or suggestions of books to add to our shelves, please talk to one of our staff members; we'd be happy to hear from you!


