# The Parish News

This Month's Message from Pastor Josh Davis

Colder temperatures are moving in and the month of December is upon us which means a new church year is about to begin, starting with the season of Advent. The word "Advent" means "arrival" or "coming." It is the season of the church year during which we prepare ourselves for the coming of Christ: First, to celebrate His birth at Christmas, and second, to be ready for His return on the Last Day when He will make all things new.

This Advent season, we'll be preparing around the theme "Holy Lands, Holy Lives." During each worship service in Advent, we'll consider a particular Biblical place which has a certain significance in the Scriptures (places like Egypt, Jerusalem, and Bethlehem). Many of these places have been in the news recently given all the fighting and unrest that has taken place in the Middle East (an area sometimes referred to as "The Holy Land"). After considering each place's unique part in God's salvation story, we'll ponder what those places have to teach us today as we prepare for a coming King by leading holy lives (2 Peter 3:11), transformed by God's Spirit and power.

Some details about scheduling: On the three **Wednesday nights** in Advent (December 6<sup>th</sup>, 13<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup>), we'll meet in the church sanctuary for worship at 6:30 pm. Following the service, you're invited to stay afterwards for a time of fellowship with hot cider or cocoa and treats to eat. On Sunday mornings we'll continue to meet at 8:00 and 10:30 am for worship (and the 9:15 Education Hour), with the exception of December 24<sup>th</sup>. For that Sunday only, there will be only one morning service at 9:00 am (the 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Advent) and no Sunday School classes. In the evening, we'll offer our regular trio of Christmas Eve services at 3:00, 5:00 and 7:30 pm. On December 31<sup>st</sup>, we'll return to our regular Sunday morning schedule with worship services at 8:00 and 10:30 am, along with a group Bible class for kids of all ages at 9:15 am (adult Bilbe classes will still meet). Then, you're invited to ring in the new year with us at the New Year's Eve service that night (7:00 pm).

In addition to so many special worship opportunities, you're also encouraged to join in Christmas caroling to our homebound members on December 3<sup>rd</sup> (right after 10:30 worship) and to attend our Children's Christmas Program, "It's a Big Deal," with music composed by Emily Dunbar, on December 10<sup>th</sup> at 2:00 pm.
