II. Things we can't u
Broken toysBroken heartsBroken lives.
Brokenness that we can't undo and that steals our breath.
Think of the times in your life that you wish you could undo and can't.
Think of the brokenness of this life that has taken your breath away.
It's moments like this that God invites us to ask the same question that He asked Ezekiel long ago: Son of man, can these bones live?
III. You can't u it. But J can.
In Ezekiel's vision, God shows the prophet that Israel's breath is gone because of their disobedience.
We see the effects of our disobeying God all over the place.
Things break. People break. Breath goes away.
"The wages of sin is death" (Romans 6:23a) We cannot undo the wages of sin. We cannot undo the loss of life
"but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord. (Romans 6:23b)
But Jesus can.

After Jesus breathes his last breath, He rises from the dead three days later to answer the same question that God had asked Ezekiel:

Son of man, can these bones live?

Jesus answers YES!

His resurrection gives us life!
