Substitute Teacher Job Description

Goal: The job of the Substitute Teacher is to supervise the classroom and teach

the lesson plans left by the absent teacher. The Substitute Teacher is responsible for the well-being and safety of the students, taking attendance, maintaining a functioning classroom, utilizing classroom management skills, leaving a clean classroom and teaching any provided

curriculum, all from a biblically sound perspective.

Overview: The Substitute Teacher shall be a born-again Christian, with at least a

bachelor's degree, who is glad to serve and guide students in a Christ like

manner

Responsible to: Principal, Vice Principal, Classroom Teacher

Supervises: Students

Personal Qualifications

The teacher shall:

- 1. Be deeply committed to a sincere, daily walk with Jesus Christ.
- 2. Believe that the Bible is God's Word and standard for faith and daily living, spending regular time reading it and being devoted to prayer.
- 3. Reflect an authentic relationship with and submission to Christ in relationship with students, fellow staff, and any parents they come in contact with.
- Respect and support the school's leadership, Statement of Faith, Vision and Mission Statements. Promptly notify administrator or school board of any policy he/she is unable to support.
- 5. Maintain a professional personal appearance, recognizing that he/she is a daily role model for students, thus reflecting school standards set for dress.

Professional Qualifications

- 1. Holds a bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university.
- 2. At least a year of classroom/substitute experience preferred.
- 3. Clean DOJ and FBI Background Check (through livescan for VCA)
- 4. Negative TB Test or waiver from doctor
- 5. Willingness to pursue higher education and continue professional development.

Job description - Essential functions

- 1. Take attendance according to VCA procedures (through FACTs)
- 2. Supervise classroom of absent teacher, fulfill any recess/break supervision of absent teacher.
- 3. Teach any provided lesson plan.

- 4. Maintain a respectful, friendly, functioning classroom environment that is conducive to learning.
- 5. Use proper discipline in the classroom and on the school premises, bringing any questions and concerns to administration or office staff.
- 6. Never leave a classroom unattended.
- 7. Ensure that students leave the classroom neat and orderly- straightening chairs and desks, picking up trash, taking with them all personal items.
- 8. Know emergency procedures and evacuation routes for the classroom.
- 9. Know procedures for behavior management- either communicated by absent teacher in advance or office staff.
