THE MESSENGER

From the Pastor's Pen

“But when the fullness of time had come, God sent forth his Son, born of woman, born under the law,⁵ to redeem those who were under the law, so that we might receive adoption as sons.”

– Galatians 4:4-5 ESV

I know we don't technically know the day or month that Jesus was born, but to me the long, cold, dark nights of December seem absolutely fitting. It's no secret that many people struggle through the dark months. We miss the light, the warmer weather, the green grass on our feet, or the sand between our toes at the beach. During the winter months our lives inevitably turn inward, we become less mobile and more reflective. Seasonal depression spikes and people look to get away somewhere warm for a vacation. Many ancient cultures, heavily affected by superstition, feared the sun would never come back with the same intensity. They relied on observances, ceremonies, or sacrifices to bring back the longer days.

As Christians, we have chosen this time to celebrate the incarnation of God (His coming to earth in the form of a man - Jesus). It just makes sense that during the darkest, coldest nights of the year, when things seem most hopeless and dark, we celebrate the coming of Christ. It's a beautiful reminder that at the time of our greatest need - God supplies.

As a side benefit, the closing days of December can be absolutely breath-taking in their own right. A blanket of snow may completely cover the ground. Snow can transform a dreary, brown countryside into a scene fit to be painted. It can drift along the roadside, cover several feet on the mountain, and accumulate on evergreens, giving a striking contrast of green with white. It's a great time of year to be reminded of the invitation given from God in Isaiah 1:18, “*Come now, let us reason together, says the LORD: though your sins are like scarlet, they shall be as white as snow; though they are red like crimson, they shall become like wool.*”

Who wouldn't want that kind of transformation? Everyone of us, at our core, feels the shame and guilt associated with sin. God invites us to trust in Him and trade that shame and guilt for salvation and forgiveness. We can be reminded of that invitation every time we see a snowfall. In the same way, every year at this time when the days are shortest and the nights are longest, we can be reminded of God's incredible ability to meet our needs. We can be reminded that at just the right time, in the fullness of time, God sent forth His Son to redeem us. When we feel our needs most acutely, when the light seems to be all but gone, look to Him in faith and know that all our needs will be met.


We had a total of 21 delicious and creative entries!


