

From the Pastor's Pen

“Because I’m a _____, I _____.”

Many different people could put a number of different words into those two blanks. Some could say, “Because I’m a rancher, I raise livestock.” Others could say, “Because I’m a student, I study.” There is an obvious, direct relationship between who you are and what you do.

One of the most significant ways we can fill those two blanks is by stating, “Because I’m a child of God, I live to please Him.” As we’ve been studying 1 John on Sunday mornings, it’s hard not to notice this connection. John has gone to great lengths to remind his readers that the fellowship we have with the Father should result in very specific actions. For instance, 1 John 2:3, “*And by this we know that we have come to know him, if we keep his commandments.*” And 1 John 3:24, “*Whoever keeps his commandments abides in God, and God in him. And by this we know that he abides in us, by the Spirit whom he has given us.*” There are several similar scriptures throughout 1 John.

Having an identity as a child of God is truly a remarkable, miraculous thing. It’s hard to fathom how individuals as flawed and as helpless as ourselves would be the object of God’s gracious love. Yet, when we receive Him as Lord and Savior, that’s exactly what takes place! God chooses to demonstrate His love for us with the image of a loving Father and a beloved child. That isn’t the end of the illustration though... After focusing on the kindness of God, John directs us to consider our own actions. As beloved children, it naturally follows that our actions should demonstrate love for Him in return and a desire to please our heavenly Father. This means our acts of ministry are natural extensions of who we are.

An image of a kind, loving parent with an ungrateful, unruly child is hard to look upon. We’ve all seen it unfortunately and we’re naturally repulsed by it. We understand it’s wrong and it frustrates us. In the same way, if we enjoy the affection of our heavenly Father and respond to that affection with selfish, sinful behavior, it’s even more revolting! As children of God, we ought to intentionally look for ways to honor Him, serve Him, and please Him with our actions.

One of the ways we do this, is by *serving* Him. Every child of God ought to be looking for ways to minister within the church and to the lost world around us. Sometimes this means crossing an ocean to serve on a short-term mission trip. It might be much closer to home, though, for instance, welcoming a visitor to church with a smile and some polite conversation. It could be serving in the nursery, preparing a meal for Wednesday night children and youth, or leading a small group Bible study. The point is, something about our *actions* ought to point to the fact that we are children of God. If we call ourselves children of God, but there are no visible signs of ministry in our lives, our actions contradict our professed identity. This is the tension that 1 John brings. We should all spend some time evaluating our professions of faith with our actions resulting from that same faith. Think of this as an “integrity check.” We say we are children of God, are we acting like it?

Be mindful in the days ahead for opportunities that God puts in your life to minister to others and please Him. This is the natural result of our faith in Him and the love relationship He initiates with us.
