## *The Constant Cycle of Dying and Rising*

*In his anguish, Jesus prayed more earnestly, and his sweat became like great drops of blood falling down on the ground. Luke 22:44*

I have always wondered if Maundy Thursday was the toughest day of Jesus' life. He saw the confusion and pain in the eyes of his disciples as he washed their feet and presented them with bread and wine, confronted the betrayal of one of his inner circle, prayed that his life could take a different course, was swept away in chains by an angry mob, and was abandoned by his closest friends. What must he have been thinking as he lived out his last day as a free man? Certainly the cross was on his mind. Often the anticipation of pain is worse than the reality of pain.

In his last hours, Jesus experienced human anguish. He knows how we suffer. He knows how we bleed and cry out. He knows how we are stunned to silence by cruelty. He knows how we stumble into loneliness. He knows the rage and shame of having freedom stripped away. Better said, he knows us. This is one of the many reasons I find Jesus so compelling; he knows our pain is real.

It has been said that life is difficult. I think that is a laughable understatement. To be human is to suffer. We know betrayal, disappointment, loneliness and conflict as intimately as we know physical pain. Moreover, we know death. Hearts that no longer beat are only part of the story. We know the death of friendships, the death of dreams, the death of income sources, the death of marriages and the death of traditions. We live in a constant cycle

of dying. If that were the end of the story, our lives would be a dark and depressing reality and you would have every reason to stop reading. Read on.

*The women were terrified and bowed their faces to the ground, but the men said to them, "Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen." Luke 24:5*

Of course, the story didn't end on that terrible Thursday or on the following Friday when Jesus was declared dead. When he walked out of his tomb, he gave us the power to do the same. No death is final. Friendships are restored, dreams are reignited and new traditions are created. Jesus promised us new life and he backed up that promise with footsteps in the morning grass of Jerusalem. More than anything, Jesus' rising has the power to change our perspective on everything. Dead ends become new possibilities, roadblocks become much-needed detours and comebacks become commonplace.

Jesus is alive. That's the end of the story. Each of us will continue to live in a cycle of dying and rising. That's Jesus' final word on the subject of life. We can stare into the darkness of our world because now we have no other choice but to expect that dawn will eventually come. We can look in the mirror and see beyond our

scars, both visible and invisible, because we have no other choice than to believe we are new creations. We can set aside our expectations of life and those we share it with and replace them with an expectancy that God is forever doing amazing things.

There is no better reason to celebrate. No amount of cynicism, anger, depression, dysfunction or fatalism can stop the promise of Jesus' rising.

Lift up your hearts this Easter!





## Follow in the Footsteps of Martin Luther

We have a unique opportunity to visit the birthplace of the Reformation, an event that changed Western history, as almost no other. # Memos to Our Older Selves

As life expectancy increases, many baby boomers and their children are serving as caregivers for elderly family members. Frequently this involves dealing with decisions made by the older person that seem not to be in his/her best interest. Remembering that as we age we become more like our parents, now may be the time to write a memo to our older selves to remind us to take actions in the future that will ensure a safe and comfortable older life. The memo might include:

1. When it seems that everyone mumbles or I have to ask people to repeat every other word, have my hearing tested and if necessary, purchase a hearing aid and WEAR IT.

2. Using a cane or walker is preferable to falling and breaking a hip.
3. Stay off ladders. Others will be happy to help change light bulbs or pick oranges.
3. When my eyesight, hearing, and/or reaction time declines making it unsafe to continue driving, give up the car keys before I injure myself or others.
4. If at some point it is no longer safe to live at home, investigate housing options before a crisis limits the available options.
5. Purchase a medical alert pendant if living alone at home.

6. Speak to family members regarding my wishes at the end of life.
7. My doctor went to medical school, I didn't. Follow the doctor's advice and instructions.
8. Review this memo often.


