Holy Communion

Part 2: Preparation

"Who, then, is properly prepared to receive this sacrament?

"Fasting and other outward preparations may serve a good purpose, but he is properly prepared who believes these words: 'Given' and 'poured out for you for the forgiveness of sins.' But whoever does not believe these words or doubts them is not prepared, because the words 'for you' require nothing but hearts that believe." (Luther's Small Catechism)

Suppose you were invited to dine with the President of the United States. How would you prepare to attend a state dinner at the White House?

You have a date to dine with the King of kings and the Lord of lords. He beckons you to his table and invites you to feast with him. How will you prepare for your date with Jesus?

Holy Communion isn't a black-tie affair, of course. God invites you to commune with him without regard for the cleanliness or quality of your clothes. Come barefoot and dressed in rags, if that's all you have, and your Savior will not turn you away.

But doesn't your Master and Your King deserve your very best? Doesn't a date with your Savior warrant reflection and preparation, as you come to meet your Lord?

Scripture teaches us that we are to worship God with reverence and with awe. (See Hebrews 12:28-29) Dining at our Savior's banquet table is not a formal wear occasion, but it's certainly nothing casual or common, either.

Just like any special occasion, preparation for Holy Communion begins long before the meal itself. Preparation for Holy Communion begins as we reflect upon who we were by nature, who we are by grace, and who it is who invites us to his table. "A man ought to examine himself before he eats of the bread and drinks of the cup." (1 Corinthians 11:28)

We are sinners who once were lost and separated from God. We've been brought near to God through the blood of Jesus. Holy Baptism sealed our place in God's family. The

one who invites us to commune is none other than the author of our salvation, Jesus himself.

The invitation to commune with Christ in the sacrament is the highest calling a human being can receive. We are fed the very body and blood that purchased our salvation, and we are served by Jesus himself. There is no finer dining experience! It is elegant. It is awe-inspiring. It is a rich feast of love.

Before you commune, reflect upon what you are about to receive. That reflection calls for more than a last-minute arrival at church and realizing, "Oh, there's Communion today!"

Fasting before Communion is not is not required to commune worthily, but it's a fine custom with a long history in the Christian church that can help you reflect on the sacrament you will receive.

Personal preparation calls for soul-searching and reflection. Are you conscious of your sins against God? If you are unaware of where you have offended God and how deep is your need for forgiveness, all you need to do is review the Ten Commandments; they'll convict you in a hurry.

Are you holding on to pet sins? Are you rebelling against God's will and unwilling to submit to him? Do not presume to commune with God, for it will be a lie! An unrepentant heart stands squarely under God's judgment. Repent!

Are you overwhelmed with a burden of guilt? Do you grieve over your sins and sense acutely your unworthiness to meet your King? Then by all means commune! Heed your Savior's invitation to receive forgiveness and peace in his feast of love! Jesus said, "Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled." (Matthew 5:6)

This, finally, is the soul that is prepared and worthy to commune. It is the soul who comes humbly – yet eagerly and joyfully – to receive the precious gift of salvation. For the words, "Given and poured out *for you*," require nothing but hearts that believe.

A message from Greg Bey, Friendly Counselor in Southeast Asia:

Having had opportunities to serve in Southeast Asia (1990-1992), Eastern Europe (1996-2011) and Southeast Asia again (2011 to present) means having had the blessings of seeing just how amazing God's grace is as it works in the hearts of people of various cultures, languages, and nations. The same amazing grace has also allowed our synod to recognize and capitalize on new methods for sharing the good news. Looking at how things have changed in a short 30-year period truly is amazing as one compares then and now.

Some of us started our ministries with manual typewriters and bottles of correction fluid. The first piece of technology that helped in reaching out with the gospel was the personal computer (PC). PCs created paperless storage of material in an electronic format, which allowed for easy revisions and reproductions of material.

Following on the heels of PCs, laptops, notebooks, tablets, Android phones, and iPads was the creation of the internet, which has connected the world in ways never before seen in history. Many of our older expatriate servants tell stories of when a letter would take three or four weeks to go from foreign fields to stateside committees that oversaw the work abroad. Now communication is instantaneous. Committee personnel and field representatives meet monthly face-to-face to discuss the ministry via video chat programs like Skype.

Evolving technology has brought changes in how people worship, study the Scriptures, encourage one another, and share their faith. Back then high-tech presentations of the Word in various venues meant using an overhead projector and transparencies. Now there's PowerPoint, which can be updated with ease. We really do have everything available at our fingertips via handheld cell phones that connect to the internet. Rather than carrying a Bible, we have it on our phones and in various translations plus all the materials for study and witnessing that are available on the Cloud.

Then and now – how technology has changed and with it the methods we use to share the unchanging message of God's amazing grace!

We will be collecting men's deodorants, body washes, and individually packaged snacks (oatmeal, fruit snacks, chips, etc.) in bins located in the church basement, ECC lobby, and near the Harris Street entrance of the school beginning Sunday, 10/25. Monetary donations may also be given through Community First Credit Union, or can be dropped off in the church office (cash or checks made payable to 'Lights of Christmas').
