# **End of Year Strategic Giving - Consider Gifting of Appreciated Shares**

As the end of 2025 approaches, many of us consider ways in which the Lord has richly blessed us this year, and to show our devotion to our Savior through our giving. St. Paul members support the ministry throughout the year with their time, talent and treasure, and by employing certain strategies our giving can be even more efficient.

One technique that has been used by our members is to give appreciated shares of stocks, ETFs, or mutual funds held more than a year. If qualified, a donor could enjoy certain tax advantages to give stocks directly over giving cash.

For example, suppose you acquired 10 shares of XYZ at \$10 per share over a year ago for \$100. Now, they are worth \$20 per share (\$200) and you donate them to the ministry. St. Paul receives a \$200 donation, and you would not pay capital gains tax, and you may be able to claim a \$200 income deduction on taxes. However, if you had cashed the shares and donated the proceeds, you might be liable for a capital gains tax of \$15-20 and be left with just \$180-185 to donate and possibly deduct from income after the capital gains tax is paid.

A transfer of stocks to St Paul is easy to do online. Simply identify the shares, get the instructions and numbers from the St. Paul brokerage account (from the church office), and instruct your brokerage to make the transfer. Be sure to keep a receipt or statement for your tax return.
