**Christmas Food Pantry Collection:** We are collecting food for the Apple Valley Food pantry as our Christmas gifts to those in need. We want to show our thanks to our Creator for what he has given us by helping those who have not been given as much. Please have your child's gift(s) to their classrooms (located near the Harris Street entrance) by Tuesday, December 21st. The following list from the pantry will indicate what your child's class is collecting:

K: Toothbrushes, applesauce and fruit in individual cups

- 1: Boxed meals (hamburger, chicken or tuna helpers) and regular pudding and jello (we have plenty of sugar free at this time)
- 2: Cookies and small plastic jars of applesauce (24 oz size)
- 3: Peanut butter and jelly/jam
- 4: Condensed tomato and chicken noodle soups, cheese flavored crackers (we have plenty of saltines)
- 5: Cereal, preferably the healthier ones (Cheerio type, Rice Krispie and Chex type, Special K, Total, etc)
- 6: Personal care products (deodorants, lotions, body washes, men's 2-in-1 products)
- 7: Cleaners & Paper Products (toilet bowl, kitchen/bath cleaner, bath tissue, facial tissue, paper towel)
- 8: Canned meats (canned chicken, tuna, ham, spam) and canned tomato paste, diced tomatoes and tomato sauce ECC: Baby items (diapers, wipes, shampoo, lotion, formula)
- \*Please note: The Pantry is unable to distribute expired, dented or partially used food.
