Council Meeting Summary - November 2025

Financial Status: The first third of our fiscal year is complete and in the books. It shows some mixed results. First, the positives: School is operating close to budget projections, and the ECC is operating in the black, with overall income slightly above expenses. Totaling-up, our year-to-date shows deficit spending of nearly \$75,000. This is nearly \$19,000 worse than budget predictions at this point of the year. The concerning piece in all the numbers is in our church offerings. Trends continue with lower church offerings, which are now \$50,000 (or 20%) behind projections. This includes two summer months where offerings are traditionally lower. Council is closely monitoring this with hope that difficult spending cuts won't need to be made.

2026-2027 Ministry Funding Plan Development: Work is already starting on developing our next fiscal year's Ministry Funding Plan. Council approved a change to the process. In prior years, school tuition rates would be set, and then rolled-up into the final budgeting process. This year, following Blueprint Schools recommendation for school financing, an initial financial support number for the school was given to the LES Board. Council unanimously approved and set that support level at \$275,000 for initial funding plan development. This support level is higher than that recommendation by the Blueprint Schools group recommendation, but lower than our historical support levels. This may create some challenges in budget development, but is a starting point.

School: Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction released report cards for individual schools involved in the School Choice program. St. Paul school, was one of two schools in the Fox Valley that achieved the highest, 5-star rating - "significantly exceeds expectations"! Congratulations to the School staff and LES board for achieving this recognition.

Council Leadership: A nominating committee will be established, as the following positions will be up for election at our April Voters Meeting: President (Perry Abitz incumbent), ECC Chairman (Jake Holm incumbent), and Spiritual Life Chairman (Mark Beitz, currently serving a 1-year appointment). Note that President Abitz is reaching his 3 term (6 years) limit. This committee will search for candidates to fill these important Council Leadership positions.
