The Song of the Angels

When the Bible was translated into Latin, "Gloria in excelsis Deo" were the first words of the song that the angels sang to the shepherds at Jesus' birth. We sing those words in English in our liturgy: "Glory be to God on high." The Song of the Angels is a compact, joyful proclamation of God's glory, mercy, and salvation, centered on the person and work of Jesus Christ.

The "Gloria" is simply praise to God the Father, acknowledging his glory and peace given to those favored by his grace. It has in mind that Christ, God's only Son, will take away the sin of the world. In Lutheran theology, the "Gloria" is a response of faith to God's saving work, rejoicing in justification by grace through faith. It is not just praise but proclamation: Christ has come, and in him, we have peace with God.

Show us the power he extends in his Word and sacraments to make us your children and keep us in faith. Thrill us with his promise to come and take us to our eternal home to live with you forever.

Open our eyes to see and believe the wonders of the Savior's love.

As we live with Christ and trust in him, move us to turn away from sin day after day with the strength your Holy Spirit provides. When we fall, forgive us and renew us to love and serve you and all people. **Empower us and guide us to walk with Christ by faith.**

Protect us from the distractions that come at this time of the year. Even in gift-giving and celebrating, keep our hearts focused on Christ and his forgiving love.

Give us joy at his coming at Christmas, his coming in the gospel, and his coming again.

Move us to share with others the most important gift of this season, the truth about Jesus. Even in busy times lead us to pray for those whose joy is diminished because of sickness, pain, or loss. [Especially bless... here name the person and the cause of the petition.] Give us opportunities to provide help to those in need.

May others see the love of Christ in our words and actions.

Hear us, Lord, as we pray in silence.
