Focus on Advent

Advent might be one of the most misunderstood seasons of the church year. The world is already in full "Christmas mode" by mid-November—lights up, music on repeat, sales everywhere. Meanwhile, the church quietly slips into a season that is not quite Christmas yet, but something deeper, more focused, and desperately needed: Advent.

The word *Advent* means "coming." During these four weeks before Christmas, we're not just circling dates on a calendar or trying to survive another December. Advent is the church's yearly call to slow down, look up, and remember who is coming, why he came, and that he will come again.

Advent has a threefold focus.

First, we look back and prepare to celebrate Christ's first coming in humility—born of a virgin, laid in a manger, wrapped not in royal robes but in simple cloths. The Son of God stepped into our world not to inspire us, but to save us. "For the Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost" (Luke 19:10). Advent helps us approach Christmas not as sentiment, but as rescue: God entering our darkness with his light.

Second, Advent focuses us on Christ's coming right now in grace—through his Word and sacraments. In a season where schedules are packed and hearts are anxious, Jesus still comes personally to his people. He speaks forgiveness into guilty consciences, gives his body and blood for the strengthening of weary believers, and comforts troubled hearts with his promises. Advent reminds us that we don't just remember a baby long ago; we receive a living Savior today.

Third, Advent teaches us to look ahead to Christ's second coming in glory. The readings for this season are full of watchfulness and urgency. Jesus says, "Therefore keep watch, because you do not know on what day your Lord will come" (Matthew 24:42). The world treats December as the end of a shopping year; Advent reminds

us there is a Day coming that will not be marked by discounts and decorations, but by trumpet sound and the visible return of Christ. For believers, that Day is not something to fear, but to long for.

That is why Advent has a tone that is both joyful and sober. The colors, the candles, the hymns—all of them gently push back against the noise of the season and invite us to repentance and hope. We confess that our hearts are often distracted, our love grows cold, and our eyes drift from the promises of God. At the same time, we hear again the good news that Christ came precisely for sinners like us.

In a world that wants everything "now," Advent teaches us to wait. Not a passive, bored waiting—but an active, hopeful one. We wait by hearing the Word, by gathering in worship, by praying, by serving, by encouraging one another. We wait, knowing that the same Lord who once came in weakness and who now comes in grace will soon come in glory.

So as the calendar fills and the days get shorter, let Advent do its quiet work in your heart. Light the candles. Come to midweek services. Open your Bible. Sing the hymns. Listen again to the promises. Your Savior is coming. He has come. He will come again. "Come, Lord Jesus" (Revelation 22:20).


Our 8am Sunday service is on YouTube and can also be heard on the radio WOSH 1490 AM and 93.9 FM (recorded) at 9am.

Spiritual Growth Opportunities

Our Sunday Morning Bible Class (9:15 a.m. in the church basement) will start a new course on January 4th. **Defending** the **Faith** is a six-lesson apologetics Bible study to help our members thoughtfully and lovingly engage in conversation with skeptics of the Christian faith. We do this using God's gift of reason which is rooted in gentleness and respect. All this with the goal

of love towards our neighbor. Apologetics is a ministry of caring!

A new Bible class will review some of our Wisconsin Synod's history over the past 175 years, with an emphasis on our congregation's involvement in that history. The class will meet in the church basement, **Wednesdays** at 6:30 PM and repeating **Thursdays** at 9:00 AM, from January 7/8 to February 11/12. The class will be taught by our member and retired pastor, Fred Toppe.

New Starting Point Class Starts 1/11: Whether you're brand new to the Bible, exploring Christianity for the first time, or simply looking for a solid refresher, Starting Point is the perfect place to begin.

What's New with Women's Ministry

We met on Tuesday, November 11 in the church basement for a meeting. Here are the items discussed:

- Fall Festival:
 - o 110 adults & 21 children's meals were served.
 - The soup sale was well received with 122 quarts from 23 different cooks donated. All but 13 were sold on Sunday. The remaining 13 were put in the church freezer & sold within the next week.
 - All 32 bags of Peppernuts were sold on Sunday.

- 48 baskets were prepared for the Raffle. Of these 4 were from the ECC, 18 from the grade school, 4 from congregation members, & 22 from local businesses.
- o Profits totaled \$3,918.23.
- Our church hosted the seminary choir on October 26 & provided a beautiful church service for us. About 85 choir members & some spouses were served roast beef, mashed potatoes/gravy, corn & desserts. The cost was about \$500 which the Women's Ministry provided.
- There was some discussion on the December 13 Bake Sale held with the Kids Only sale & help with the Sunshine Cookie distribution on December 15. The congregation is invited to prepare baked goods & if possible, help with the cookie distribution.
- The ECC & Women's Ministry will again hold a drive for donated items in December. WM will give ECC a \$300 Sam's Club gift card for purchasing the Free & Clear laundry detergent. WM voted to fund the ECC Wish List up to \$1,000.
- The school needs a new laminator. WM voted to fund up to \$2,500 for this. Items from the grade school Wish List & church Wish List will be discussed at a later meeting.
- We voted to continue giving a \$25 memorial or celebration contribution to the radio broadcast ministry for Women's Ministry members.

WM will serve the **December 10 Advent meal**. The plan is to serve brats, hot dogs, beans, salad, chips & bars. Please join us for church & food as we prepare our hearts for the Savior's birth.
