## **Spiritual Growth Opportunities**

**Our Sunday Morning Bible Class** (9:15 a.m. in the church basement) will start a new course on January 4th. **Defending the Faith** is a six-lesson apologetics Bible study to help our members thoughtfully and lovingly engage in conversation with skeptics of the Christian faith. We do this using God's gift of reason which is rooted in gentleness and respect. All this with the goal of love towards our neighbor. Apologetics is a ministry of caring!

**A new Bible class** will review some of our Wisconsin Synod's history over the past 175 years, with an emphasis on our congregation's involvement in that history. The class will meet in the church basement, **Wednesdays** at 6:30 PM and repeating **Thursdays** at 9:00 AM, from January 7/8 to February 11/12. The class will be taught by our member and retired pastor, Fred Toppe.

**New Starting Point Class Starts 1/11:** Whether you're brand new to the Bible, exploring Christianity for the first time, or simply looking for a solid refresher, Starting Point is the perfect place to begin.

This 8-week course offers a welcoming, no-pressure environment to ask questions, discover what the Bible says, and learn the core truths of the Christian faith. We'll cover topics like:



#### **December 2025 Council Meeting Summary**

#### **Financial Status:**

With 5 months complete in our fiscal year, we find ourselves a few thousand dollars ahead of budget predictions. This is largely due to expenses being lower than planned, as our church offerings continue a slight downward trend. Currently we are almost 10% below predictions at this point in the fiscal year for church offering income. Council will continue to monitor this closely. ECC is operating in the black, and our School is close to budget predictions.

#### **Next Year's Ministry Funding Plan:**

Work has started on the next fiscal year plan. One focus area will be developing a plan to get back to Synod recommendations for housing allowances for our called workers. This hasn't been adjusted for a few years, and housing values have increased significantly.

#### **Projects:**

A team is detailing out renovations to the school bathrooms, with a goal of presenting a project and funding plan at the January 27, 2026 Voters Meeting. A lot of work needs to take place in the next 7 weeks to meet this goal. The installation window is just about 8 weeks this coming summer. Regarding our past summer projects: a few more signs will be going up around the parking lot to complete that project, and the ECC project is finally wrapping-up. Look for summaries of these projects and final spending reports at that January Voters Meeting.

### St. Paul Ministries Campus Security:

A task force will begin meeting in January to re-evaluate our entire campus security systems and procedures and look for improvements to make the entire campus safer.

# **FVL Potential Classroom Expansion:**

Council received a report from a member who attended one of the FVL expansion informational meetings. Summarizing this in a few sentences will be difficult. Enrollment projections will cause FVL to potentially start turning away Federation member enrollment as early as the 2028-29 school year due to capacity constraints. They are looking to add 10 classrooms on the NW corner of the school. This will increase enrollment capacity to above 1100 at an estimated project cost of 9.6 million dollars. The project team is finalizing cost estimates and the finance team is developing a funding plan. Timeline is to take the project proposal to the FVL general Board meeting in May 2026, and if approved, ground-breaking would occur in Spring of 2027, with completion in time for the 2028-29 School Year.
