Dear members of St. Paul.

Did you know that there is a very significant birthday approaching? No, it's not Pastor Frey's, or even the synod's; it's our organ's! On February 28th, 1932, the new Kilgen organ was dedicated to the glory of God as part of St. Paul's twenty-fifth anniversary celebration. That means our organ is coming up on its ninetieth birthday! For ninety years this congregation has supported the use of and has been edified by this wonderful instrument in weekly worship. As some of you may remember, a little after the organ's sixtieth birthday, there was a "makeover", and it was equipped with new and/or repaired pipes. The '95 refurbishing is a blessing that we still treasure today.

So here we are, thirty years later, and we are finding that the lovely Kilgen/Taylor needs some work; a "surgery", if you will! Like most surgeries, there will be an expense. Phil Swartz and Associates estimates that it will cost about \$35,000 to update and repair the current problems we are experiencing. The recommendation is to outfit our organ with a new console, which includes new keys (the 1932 ivories are chipped and damaged), a new memory bank, and sound enhancements. Basically, this is a way in which to best preserve the pipe organ sound with convenient, updated electronics. Phil estimates that it will take about five weeks for the repair process. What a great birthday gift that would be to complete this by Sunday, February 27, 2022, one day shy of the 1932 dedication date!

It is evident that having quality music in our sanctuary is important to this congregation. Over the years, this church has invested in instrumental and choir music, handbells, chimes, and most recently, in the purchase of the beautiful grand piano in front. Now it is time to give attention to our ninety-year-old, so that her music may continue to fill our hearts and souls for generations to come. Prayerfully consider supporting this investment in worship.
