IM is a WELS para-synodical; it was formed to function alongside the WELS and to offer services not provided by WELS. Although IM works closely with WELS Special Ministries, IM receives no funds through the synodical budget. It exists because individuals, churches, and foundations have a passion for hurting souls and desire to support the work being done by this ministry.

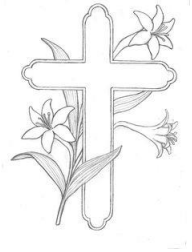
St. Paul Lutheran ECC in Appleton is hiring!
