C: Amen.


OLD TESTAMENT

READING & SERMON TEXT

1 Corinthians 15:51-57

⁵¹Listen, I tell you a mystery: We will not all sleep, but we will all be changed—⁵²in a flash, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet. For the trumpet will sound, the dead will be raised imperishable, and we will be changed. 53For the perishable must clothe itself with the imperishable, and the mortal with immortality. ⁵⁴When the perishable has been clothed with the imperishable, and the mortal with immortality, then the saying that is written will come true: "Death has been swallowed up in victory." ⁵⁵"Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?" ⁵⁶The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. ⁵⁷But thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.

CHOIR SINGS See What a Morning

GOSPEL Luke 24:1-12

¹On the first day of the week, very early in the morning, the women took the spices they had prepared and went to the tomb. ²They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, ³but when they entered, they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus. ⁴While they were wondering about this, suddenly two men in clothes that gleamed like lightning stood beside them. ⁵In their fright the women bowed down with their faces to the ground, but the men said to them, "Why do you look for the living among the dead? ⁶He is not here; he has risen! Remember how he told you, while he was still with you in Galilee: ¹'The Son of Man must be delivered over to the hands of sinners, be crucified and on the third day be raised again.'" ¹Then they remembered his words. ¹When they came back from the tomb, they told all these things to the Eleven and to all the others. ¹Olt was Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and the others with them who told this to the apostles. ¹¹But they did not believe the women, because their words seemed to them like nonsense.

¹²Peter, however, got up and ran to the tomb. Bending over, he saw the strips of linen lying by themselves, and he went away, wondering to himself what had happened.

CONFESSION OF FAITH

P: The Apostle Paul writes concerning the resurrection of Christ, "If Christ has not been raised, our preaching is useless and so is your faith ... You are still in your sins" (1 Corinthians 15:14,17b). Let us then confess our faith in the Triune God and in Jesus Christ, who "has indeed been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep" (1 Corinthians 15:20).

C: I believe "that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, 4that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures, 5and that he appeared to Peter, and then to the Twelve. 6After that, he appeared to more than five hundred of the brothers at the same time, most of whom are still living, though some have fallen asleep. 7Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles For since death came through a man, the resurrection of the dead comes also through a man. 22For as in Adam all die, so in Christ all will be made alive. 23But each in his own turn: Christ, the firstfruits; then, when he comes, those who belong to him. 24Then the end will come, when he hands over the kingdom to God the Father after he has destroyed all dominion, authority and power. 25For he must reign until he has put all his enemies under his feet. 26The last enemy to be destroyed is death." (1 Corinthians 15:3-7, 21-26)

CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS

- P: Christ is risen!
- C: He is risen indeed! Alleluia!
- P: Jesus Christ was the first to conquer death, the ruler of all the kings of the earth.
- C: He loves us, and by His blood He set us free from our sins.
- P: Let us therefore approach the throne of grace with boldness, so that we may receive mercy, and find grace to help in time of need. Most merciful God,
- C: we confess to You that we are dead in our trespasses and sins. We have acted as if You are not present in our lives. So often we have failed to be faithful witnesses. In Your great mercy, deliver us from the death we deserve, for the sake of Jesus Christ.
- P: Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! By His great mercy, He has given us a new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead.
- C: In Him, we have forgiveness, life, and resurrection from the dead.
- P: If the Spirit of God, who raised Jesus from the dead, dwells in You, then the One who raised Christ from death will also give life to your mortal bodies. As a called and ordained servant of Christ, and by His authority, I therefore forgive you all your sins, in the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit.
