Voters Meeting Summary May 20, 2025

Financial Status:

Relatively good news to share with just 2 months remaining in our fiscal year.

- April finished negative \$34,000, but was better than budget of a \$53,000 loss for the month, so good news there.
- Church offerings, which have been significantly below budget earlier this year, and also have been trending down, have recovered, and are slightly above budget (by 3.5%) at this point in our fiscal year. However, we have the historically low month of June to account for yet. Hopefully we have reversed the trend of decreasing church offerings.
- ECC the last 7 months have been in the black, and their current projections indicate they could recover from their deficit spending from the first three months of the fiscal year!
- School is operating close to the budget for income while also managing expenses below budgeted predictions!
- Overall, we are about \$74,000 in the black at this point. One last school choice / SNSP payment from the State will come in May. However, historically the month of June our expenses greatly exceed our income.
 We are now projecting no deficit spending or even a surplus at the end of this fiscal year.

Council Summary

Following a presentation by FVL's Reverend Tom Mielke (Director of Mission Advancement), where Council learned our high school is implementing a plan to reserve money for use in the event that the School Choice program/funding is eliminated, or the courts/legislature place non-biblical teaching requirements on our schools (where we would withdraw from the program). Those monies would be used to support staff and students during the transition away from that program. Council unanimously approved a motion to direct the LES board to begin reserving funds for that same purpose. As our next fiscal budget is nearing final form, this would begin with the 2026-2027 budget.
