**A message from the Apple Valley Food Pantry:** Our next

pantry collection date is **Sunday, June 14, 2020**. Feel free to drop donations off in the St. Paul Church basement beginning 5/31. If you are not comfortable worshipping in-person, donations can be taken directly to the pantry at St. Matthew's (129 S. Mason Street in Appleton). Items needed by the food pantry are: **Cereal (on average between 150-175 boxes are needed per month), cookies, crackers, boxed potatoes, canned fruits, macaroni and cheese, hamburger helpers, toilet paper and paper towel, pancake mix and syrup, tomato and chicken soups, all canned meats, peanut butter, and healthy snacks.**

## **Church Council Meeting Summary**

### **6:30 pm – May 19, 2020**

Due to the statewide Coronavirus situation, the Council conducted an 'online' meeting.

BOE would like to increase Mike's Schultz's call from  $\frac{3}{4}$  to a full-time. The school environment next year will be very restrictive due to additional coronavirus protection measures. Mike is the best person for our needs. Additional help will be needed to support families struggling with the virtual learning challenges. Grade 1 will need help in reading and math. The call would be a 1-year call. We have 50 School Choice students signed up for next year. \$23K is budgeted for classroom help. We should be able to fund the full-time cost difference by shifting a few things around. A motion to approve a full-time call for Mike Schultz and take it to the voters was seconded and approved.

Our goal is to pay off the ECC loan by June 2021. This will be on the top of the wish list.

April receipts were \$13,900 higher than April last year. There is little ECC income, but some expenses. 80%-90% of our costs are covered by the PPP loan. A School Choice payment is coming in May. There is a possibility of additional stimulus money coming. We don't expect any School Choice cuts this year because we've been in session. We don't expect any negative changes the next couple of years.

The new constitution is back from Synod with very minor changes. A motion to present it to the voters for approval was seconded and approved.

We need the ECC basement drawings. This has been approved at a voter's meeting. We may also need the school basement to accommodate new spacing guidelines. We will form a special committee.

Some members and ECC parents donated about \$3,100 to aid the ECC staff during the shutdown. ECC is opening on May 26<sup>th</sup> and not everyone will be coming back right away. There are new rules about spacing.

Voter's Meeting – May 31, 2020. This is our quarterly meeting. Agenda - constitution, budget synopsis, and teacher call.
