Even though we are, by nature, enemies of God and dead in sin, God made us alive with Christ and brought us peace with God. By nature we are self-servers, but God has made us his servants, willing to serve others and the needs of the church.

Of course, the danger is that we can wrench our shoulders out of joint patting ourselves on the back. So, let us in humility praise God for his grace to us. Along with prayers of thanksgiving to our gracious God may we add prayers that we will grow more and more in our faith through more time spent in the Word and a deeper study of the truths of our salvation. That is spiritual growth and there is no other way to accomplish it. But as we do grow spiritually, God will work through us more and more so that he will accomplish even more through St. Paul Lutheran Ministries.

A message from Pastor Caleb Free, Risen Savior Lutheran Church, Lakewood Ranch, Florida:

Risen Savior had never hosted a soccer camp before, and the thought of our small mission church running the camp was intimidating. However, our District Mission Board told us that we should contact Mission Journeys, because they could potentially help us. When we called Shannon Bohme at Mission Journeys and told him our situation, he immediately went to work to find a mission team to help with our camp.

Within a matter of weeks, our soccer camp went from a dream to a reality. Mission Journeys connected us with a combined youth group in Minnesota (14 youths and 2 chaperones) who were very experienced with running soccer camps. Through email and phone conversations, the leaders simply told our congregation what to buy and how to advertise. They said that they would take care of the rest when they got there.

It's easy to say that God blessed the efforts of both Risen Savior and our Mission Journeys team. We scheduled the soccer camp for the end of June and, of course, we didn't know how many kids would sign up. Optimistically, we decided to set the capacity at 75. By the middle of May, we had reached our capacity and had to begin a waiting list. Through the registration process, we

identified many people who were interested in hearing more about our church, and we have continued to reach out to them.

The camp itself was also a success. The youth group, with guidance form their chaperones, jumped right in to running the camp. They played games, they ran drills, and they showed love to the kids. What was most impressive was the love of Christ that showed through them to the kids (and their parents). Numerous parents came up to us throughout the week and said that they could not believe how amazing this youth group was at interacting with and teaching their kids.

This Mission Journeys team helped our congregation put on a community soccer camp, which, by ourselves, we could not do. Through their efforts they displayed the love of Christ, and they have given us more opportunities to proclaim his love in Lakewood Ranch.
