Dress yourself with...Compassion

Every so often the news will carry a story about a school struggling with the question of going to mandatory uniforms. It's easy to understand the logic. Some of the most respected people in our society are those who wear uniforms.

Proponents of school uniforms could probably produce studies that show that students are more likely to respect themselves and each other when wearing uniforms, too.

On the other hand, we also hear stories about people bringing disgrace to the uniforms they wear: criminal charges against professional ballplayers, corruption in police departments, and sexual abuse by clergy. Examples such as these indicate that just putting on a uniform does not make a person better.

Listen to the apostle Paul describe a different kind of clothing: "Therefore, as God's chosen people, holy and dearly loved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience" (Colossians 3:12).

Notice that Paul isn't just describing a change in outward appearances. Nor is he suggesting that we can somehow will ourselves into better behavior. We don't earn the right to wear the clothes Paul describes. They come from being loved by God.

It all starts with the compassion Jesus had that moved him to lay down his life for the world.

Believing that Jesus loved us enough to die for us is what makes us one of his people. It also is what produces a change in our attitude.

As God's dearly loved people, we want to reflect the kind of compassion Jesus showed. That is something that will be as plain to see as any uniform.

Real changes in our lives won't happen just because we put on a district-mandated or color-coordinated outfit. That clothing just changes us on the outside. The inner change begins when we are clothed with God's love.

St Paul Ministries Campus Projects – Update July 2021

School Classroom Addition / Relocation of Pastoral Offices: This project relocates pastoral offices to the NE corner of school, and utilizes that space and the conference room to create an additional classroom due to enrollment. A new conference room is being built in the ECC basement. The project is on schedule. Painting has started and will be completed by July 23rd. Flooring installation will begin on July 26th. Anticipated final ontime completion is August 13.

ECC Basement: We are completing construction from the original build in the basement to facilitate growth (additional classroom), and a dedicated room for the before and after school programs. This project is on schedule with drywall completed. Painting has started and will be completed on July 23rd. Flooring will start on July 26th. Final completion of all work is on time and will follow a few days behind the school and office projects.

Gym Ceiling Replacement: This project addressed safety, as the original ceiling tile glue was failing and tiles were falling down. The project started in June, but the installation strategy was changed for a better finished appearance. This did incur some increased costs, due to additional material needed. About 2-3 days of work remain, with anticipated completion before school starts.

Flooring Replacement in School Lower Level Room (Library/STEM): Flooring needed to be replaced after carpet was damaged from flooding. Laminated Vinyl Plank Flooring has been installed and the move back-in to that room has been completed.

Increased size of concrete pad on School North Entrance for student drop-off/pick-up: Meeting with city to discuss impact to street and parking. This project will also eliminate the old driveway on the West side of the school building that now goes nowhere.

Financial Status: There has been some increased scope and changes, but at this time all projects spending remains at voter approved amounts (listed below) with contingency. (Note, loading pad cost is not included)

We are utilizing our project line of credit at Nicolet Bank for \$300,000.

Special gift donations for these projects are now at \$142,000 (including insurance settlement for flood damage). A corporate match gift of \$10,000 is expected by the end of August.

Council is planning to have an open house on School Registration Sunday (August 22nd), for Congregation members and guests to view these facility improvements!

ECC Update

Work is well underway on the ECC basement expansion, and we are on track for completion the end of August. We are blessed to be able to expand our facility, specifically in the infants and one's rooms, to serve more families. Along with that comes the need to add more teachers and assistants to our team. With work being completed by Fall, we are looking to bring new employees on right away to get them trained and ready to care for more children. We are currently hiring 2 assistant teachers and a floater.

We are also looking for a 2-year-old room lead teacher. This position is full time and involves lesson planning, record keeping, and assessments of the children. Previous training and experience in childcare or education is preferred.

All full time positions include benefits such as paid time off (holidays, sick days, vacation days, etc.), health insurance option, etc. A competitive wage is based on education and experience.
