Additional Sunday Worship Service Added

The Church Council decided to add a third worship service on Sunday mornings. That third worship service will begin on September 13. Starting that Sunday our Worship Service Schedule will be 8:00 a.m., 9:15 a.m., and 10:30 a.m. (Monday worship will continue to start at 6:00 p.m.). By mandate of the governor, face coverings are to be worn indoors.

The reasons for this additional service include:

- 1. We have been close to reaching our maximum capacity (CDC recommendation of 25% of capacity with 6 feet of social distancing between family groups) on some Sunday worship services this summer, especially on communion Sundays.
- 2. Church leadership was hopeful CDC recommendations would be bumped up to 50% of capacity by this Fall, but that seems unlikely.
- 3. Church leadership anticipates an increase in Sunday worship attendance that typically happens after Labor Day.

This additional Sunday Worship service will be during our normal Sunday Bible Class and Sunday School time. For the time being (starting September 13) Sunday Bible Class will not be offered. We will be offering Wednesday night Bible Class and Thursday morning Bible Class. Digital/Online Bible Classes will likely still be offered. We are hoping to still offer on-site/in-person Sunday School starting September 13.

Your pastors and the Spiritual Growth Board will reevaluate this new Sunday schedule at their October 6th meeting.

A message from the 'Friendly Counselor' to Nepal/Pakistan:

I have enjoyed serving two missions, Pakistan and Nepal, since 2008 (full time since January of 2015). Pakistan is 97 percent Muslim. Nepal is 83 percent Hindu, 12 percent Buddhist, and 4 percent Muslim. Only 1 percent of the population is Christian in both countries. In spite of persecution, both churches are thriving. We have 58 house churches in Pakistan. We teach the leaders of the house churches through long-distance learning.

The church in Nepal started with two people in 2002 and today has more than 4,200 members with 51 congregations in 32 of the country's 75 districts. Our goal is to reach all 75 districts as God enables.

In Nepal we provide Christian lecture in two ways—on paper and on Secure Digital (SD) memory cards. We put the SC cards into smartphones. In this way, we hope to bring the gospel to Tibet, which is north of Nepal.

Transporting books of Christian literature sometimes is dangerous. SD cards are safe and easy to use. A library of books, videos, and Christian music can be transported in a space no larger than a thumbprint.

Every week our church in Pakistan produces a 30-minute television show, which is broadcast to much of the Muslim world. We invite viewers of the show to visit a website with Christian literature and videos for more information. In this way, a group of 1,000 Christians is reaching millions of people.

Our classrooms are quite full and we thank God for bringing returning and new children to us in this time of uncertainty! Our staff has prepared for the event of a quarantine or short term closure where we will switch to a virtual learning platform, but we are thrilled to have in person learning the majority of the time.

The ECC is currently hiring for several positions due to the enhanced protocols we have implemented due to the virus. Our enrollment is larger than anticipated (what a blessing!) and additional staff are needed.
