Social Distance and the Lord's Supper

"For I received from the Lord what I also passed on to you: The Lord Jesus, on the night he was betrayed, took bread, ²⁴ and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, "This is my body, which is for you; do this in remembrance of me." ²⁵ In the same way, after supper he took the cup, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood; do this, whenever you drink it, in remembrance of me." ²⁶ For whenever you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes." (1 Corinthians 11:23-26)

Over the last couple years, we have had to shut down in-person worship, wear masks and social distance. Since we have been back to in-person worship, we have altered the way we serve communion, closed off every other pew and wore masks.

Masks are no longer required by the government so we have made the wearing of masks optional. Almost anywhere you go today, social distancing is left for people to do on their own. So, we no longer block off every other pew. We trust those who are concerned to social distance as they choose.

Some people in our congregation may still be concerned about COVID transmission, especially with new variants of the virus. We understand that. That is why we have the radio broadcast and the Facebook page as alternatives to in-person worship.

However, you can't receive the Lord's Supper through the radio or the computer. Consider the following paragraph from an article by Reinhart Buchholz in the Wisconsin Lutheran Quarterly from 1966:

"There is no plainer evidence that a congregation or a synod is decadent than the decline in Communion attendance and the deterioration of Communion discipline. 'In the Supper of the Lord is the heart-beat of the Church. Where the heart dies, the whole body dies. The Church dies with the Lord's Supper' [Hermann Sasse, "Kirche und Herrenmahl"]. Communion cannot be replaced by mere preaching. Only where the Gospel is preached in its truth and purity can the Sacrament be preserved and rightly administered. And only where the Sacrament is rightly celebrated can the preaching of the Gospel remain pure. The congregation must have concern for both. No one can understand Luther's contending for the Lord's Supper, if he overlooks the fact that giving up the divinely-instituted celebration of the Lord's Supper inevitably leads to a disintegration of the faith. For Luther the struggle for the divinely-instituted use of the Sacrament was at the same time a struggle for pure doctrine. Justifying faith belongs to a blessed attendance at the Lord's Table."

We should not consider the Lord's Supper optional. It is an integral part of our worship and spiritual life. If you are concerned about in-person worship, contact the church office for someone to bring you the Lord's Supper privately. If you don't, we will assume that you will again make attendance at the Lord's Supper a priority in your life.

A message from Mr. Dan Katzinski, member of Amazing Love Lutheran Church in Frankfort, IL:

Through the Mission Journeys program, Amazing Love Lutheran Church in Frankfort, IL, sponsored a mission trip to visit fellow Christians in Ukraine in September 2019. The Ukrainian Lutheran Church (ULC) shares fellowship with WELS with over 650 members, 17 congregations, 13 pastors, and 5 worship facilities.

Our objectives were centered on fellowship and exploration for future interaction with our brothers and sisters.

What started as a plan to visit with a group of men morphed into a trip with two men and two teens focused heavily on youth fellowship.

Pastor Dustin Blumer and Dan Katzinski were accompanied by Bella Blumer (Pastor's daughter, an 8th grader at Good Shepherd Lutheran Academy in Downers Grove, IL) and Ryan Witt (Dan's stepson, a freshman at Illinois Lutheran High School in Crete, IL) for 10 days in Ukraine. We flew into and out of Kyiv (the capital) and spent six days in the southern region of the country on the Black Sea. Every part of Ukraine we visited was stunningly beautiful.

The trip spanned two Sundays with Pastor Blumer preaching in four churches, four days at a school in the southern Ukrainian village if Ivanivka, and four evenings at the church in Ivanivka for fellowship, Bible Study, music, and worship.

The journey exceeded every expectation of the mission team! The trip was immeasurably more than we had asked for or imagined! The Ukrainians shared their history, culture, food, and ministry with us. They made us feel like family from the moment we arrived in the country. Bella and Ryan made close friends whom they hope to see again at the annual ULC Youth Rallies in Ukraine.
