8:00 &11:00 Hymn Series - "Songs From the Storm" Some of the most powerful hymns in the Christian tradition were not penned in moments of peace, but in the crucible of suffering. They arose not from ease, but from aching loss, deep trial, and desperate hope. Over the next few weeks, in concurrence with Pastor Jim's Sermon Series, "Praise Him In This Storm?", the Chancel Choir and soloists will present anthems and program notes that will explore the stories behind these "songs from the storm" and the people who wrote them. May their words remind us that even in our darkest moments, God gives us songs to sing. This week's featured hymn is "Day By Day and With Each Passing Moment," written by Carolina Sandell. Sandell, born in 1832, was the daughter of a Lutheran pastor in Sweden and became the country's most beloved hymn writer, writing over 650 hymns in her lifetime. At age 26, while crossing Lake Vättern with her father, a tragic accident occurred: the boat lurched, and she watched helplessly as her father fell overboard and drowned. This heartbreak deeply shaped her faith and inspired a new depth in her songwriting. Though she had written hymns before, this loss opened a floodgate of songs filled with trust in God's care in the midst of doubt, pain, and grief. "Day By Day and With Each Passing Moment" was written shortly after her father's death and remains her most well-known work.

"Help me then, in every tribulation, so to trust Thy promises, O Lord,
That I lose not faith's sweet consolation offered me within Thy holy Word.
Help me, Lord, when toil and trouble meeting, e'er to take, as from a Father's hand,
One by one, the days, the moments fleeting, till I reach the promised land."
