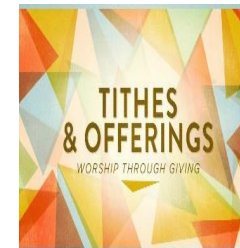

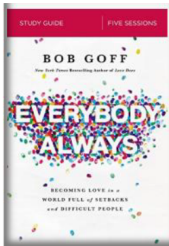

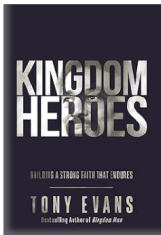

Important Tharros Village Update for Volunteers Delivering Food

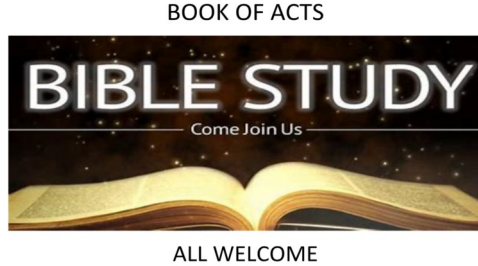
On the pedestrian entrance gate there is now a lockbox that contains a FOB. The FOB pad is beside the lockbox.
