New advisors will need to have a background check performed; Trinity will contact you to coordinate that.

Some basics

Why should I participate?

The Mexico mission trip is a rewarding experience! Just ask the people who have been on this trip for many years, and they will be sure to tell you of the worthwhile work and team building that takes place. As an advisor you will facilitate an encounter with God that students may not have had before. You will have the opportunity to be a part of a team that has the chance to give something back and build homes for those who would not otherwise be able to have them. In this week, lives are changed, memories are made, and hearts are brought closer to Christ. It truly is an incredible week.

What's an advisor?

All adults who come on the trip are considered advisors. Some may be site leaders, some may coordinate particular aspects, some may be speakers, but all adults on the trip have equal duties as an advisor.

What does an advisor do?

As advisors we are the leaders of the trip. You will be attending advisor meetings to discuss the planning of the trip and basically providing leadership to the kids. In Mexico and before we go, you will also be asked to participate in **ALL** the activities. You will be expected to play games at Mandatory Mexico Meetings (MMMs), learn the students' names, and be at group gatherings at the campsite, meals, small group, and content times. Advisors are needed at these times to model good listening and participation as well as to keep tabs on the students. They will look to advisors as examples, and we need you to model respectful behavior.

What kind of advisors are we looking for?

An advisor is an adult who loves the Lord, enjoys interaction with teenagers, can set firm boundaries, and knows how to be a friend. Teens need adults who will mentor them, teach them, befriend them, and walk beside them. We don't need bossy, controlling, or judgmental people as advisors. We call an advisor a "friendly parent."

Christian role modeling

In order to help develop the lives of students, advisors are charged to develop their own relationships with Christ through personal prayer and Bible study, as well as regular attendance at worship. In addition, advisors are expected to do their best in exhibiting Christian conduct, whenever possible. This includes refraining from cussing, slander, and disrespectful behavior towards youth or other advisors. No use of alcohol or drugs by adults is permitted on this trip.

Team players

It takes a great deal of planning to make this trip a success. We need adults who will work together to support the mission trip and who are able to follow direction of the group's leader. If you have a problem or disagreement, bring it up at an advisor meeting or talk to a Mexico Leadership Team Member directly about it. It is inappropriate to discuss any disagreements you may have about the trip with the kids or

in front of them. We also need people who are interested in facilitating this experience for the *youth*. While we get lots out of this trip, the trip is primarily for the students. We need to be on the same page about providing a good experience for them.

Safety

On this trip we will be in another country working with unskilled laborers around dangerous materials. Parents are expecting their kids to come back whole, mentally and physically. We need to make sure that all people are careful on the work site, especially when it gets late and we are tired. Drivers should not drive recklessly and should always stay with the group. We want all people to feel safe on this trip.

It is important for adult advisors to remember their roles as facilitators of positive experiences, and to refrain from contact with youth that might be considered aggressive, overly competitive, sexual, or not in the best interest of the youth. This includes romantic involvement. Don't become romantically involved with a student during the trip or date them after we return.

Challenges

You will be challenged physically as well as emotionally and spiritually. This trip is only one week, but those seven days are filled with long days of driving and labor accompanied with short nights. This trip is no picnic. In addition, we go for a week without many of our luxuries. We stay in a campground with no running water and minimal electricity, so this is a week of roughing it. These conditions are breeding grounds for stress and thin nerves, but we are still a large family living and working together. That comes with all the benefits and challenges.

Time commitment

This trip involves more than the week we are actually working. There are many dates ahead of the trip that require your presence for team building, planning and support. Before turning in this application, please prayerfully consider this commitment and check your calendar to ensure your availability on **ALL** these dates – both student and advisor-only events. (**MMM = Mandatory Mexico Meeting**)

You obviously need to be available for the dates of the trip. Beyond that you are required to attend the advisor meetings, which are important for training, planning, and clarifying questions. The MMMs are necessary for you to learn the students' names, find out a bit about who they are, and meet your small group. The Garage Sale is a big part of what makes it possible for us to go on this trip. As an advisor you are asked only to cover your food costs, and it is necessary for you to be a part of the fundraising to show support for the students and lend a hand in the work. Plan on being at the Garage Sale all day, and please help with preparation the week before if at all possible. The church sends us off with the Commissioning service the week before we leave, and we report

back to them at the Sharing service after we return. These services are important in the life of the church because we are taking them with us in our hearts and they want to be a part of the experience. The church congregation also heavily supports all of the Mexico activities.

Registration

After you have checked your calendar and filled out the application, please complete the following steps by Sunday, February 4 to register.

 - This is a different form than the Student Registration.
 - Please read each question carefully and answer each one honestly. The only people who will be reading your answers are the Mexico Leadership Team, so please be honest.
- 2. **Permission Form Print** and sign the last page of this packet and bring it to church.
- 3. **Payment** Depending on our fundraising and budget status, we may charge a small advisor fee to cover your food costs. We will inform you later in the season.
- 4. **Amor Ministries Registration** Every participant must complete this Amor participation form: https://amor.org/participation-form/
 - Search for our group's name Trinity Presbyterian Church, San Carlos.
 - Then select our name and trip dates, *Andrew 'Drew' Schulz*, 4/5/2024-4/9/2024.
- Immigration (border crossing) form This will be provided to you prior to our departure.
