Frequently Asked Questions

Are the Mandatory Mexico Meetings (MMMs) really mandatory? Why?

- Yes, the meetings are mandatory. The MMMs are the way we bond as a team, provide necessary trainings, and communicate important details and info about the trip.

What do we do at the meetings?

- We spend time playing “get-to-know-you” games, singing, hearing a message, talking in small groups, and getting important updates and trip info. That’s a lot to cover in 2 hours, so please, BE ON TIME. Thanks.

Are the fundraisers mandatory? What if I can’t come? What’s my part?

- The fundraisers are mandatory. However, if you have something very important that day that you cannot get out of, let Drew know as soon as possible BY EMAIL. Tell him verbally and he’ll forget. Send him a text message and he might miss it, Facebook will probably work, but email will definitely work. You will get more information about working the fundraisers at the MMM before the event.

Who assigns the groups (small groups and site)?

- Mexico leadership assigns the small groups, and Drew Schulz (an advisor) does all the other assignments.

How much money should I bring on the trip? What’s it for?

- You’ll need spending money for food and shopping at the extended stop we take on our way back and money for a few fast food meals on the trip (3 lunches and 1 breakfast). Please don’t bring an excessive amount of money, \$50-\$60 is enough.

Who picks who gets the houses that we build? What’s Amor’s involvement?

- AMOR (the organization that organizes our trip) works with local Mexican churches and their pastors. The pastors recommend families that need assistance and AMOR buys supplies for the house-building. We bring the work and love, while AMOR provides the supplies and support.

How do I contact the mission team while you’re away?

- Prior to departure we’ll provide information about emergency phone numbers, including the AMOR number and directions on how to get updated information on our trip and our arrival time.

What if somebody gets injured? What kinds of safety precautions do you take?

- We have at least one advisor that has first aid and CPR training, and they will take any serious injuries to a hospital in the U.S. We also minimize the possibility of injury or sickness by training the students on safety precautions and providing food and water through a contract food service in Mexico.

What’s security like at the campsite?

- AMOR works with local authorities to provide a secure campground. They also have round-the-clock supervision provided. We are very safe!

Who are the advisors?

- The advisor team is a group of adults from the church and community who volunteer to be part of this trip and facilitate the life-changing experience of Trinity’s Mexico mission trip for the youth. We are committed to at least a 3 to 1 student/adult ratio.

Mexico Mission Trip Student Internship 2019

Purpose of Student Internship

Each year during spring break a group of approximately 60 high school students and adult advisors travel to a Mexican border town where, in four days, they build homes for impoverished Mexican families. These 22' x 11' homes are built on a foundation and have two rooms, a door, windows, a tarred roof, and stucco exterior walls to protect the family from outside elements. Often this house is the home a family has been hoping and praying for.

Leading up to the trip, students and adult advisors prepare for the trip through our "Mandatory Mexico Meetings" (MMMs). Games, discussion, prayer, singing and fun make up the content of these MMMs.

This year we'd like to have two Student Interns help plan, run, and facilitate a variety of activities that happen during the MMMs and the trip itself.

Responsibilities

MMMs

- Meet twice with Drew Schulz and Pastor Kurt Heineman to plan games and activities for the 4 MMMs.
- During the MMMs run the games and activities and be a friendly presence to everyone.

Garage Sale

- Help the Garage Sale Chairpersons (Annette and Alicia) organize students to work shifts during the week and during the sale.

During the Trip

- Hand out the daily awards (Fouts Hammer, and the Soupy).
- Be on the leadership team that makes important decisions.
- Select students to pray before meals.
- Select students to lead devotionals in the mornings before we leave to work sites.

Requirements

To be considered for the Student Internship, you must have already gone on the trip at least once.

Compensation

As a student intern, you will receive a full scholarship for the Mexico Mission Trip for your time and energy spent as an intern.
