Please read over all the material in this packet which includes information, dates, and requirements about the trip. There are some details that are still to be determined based on the number of participants that go, but we are providing the most complete information we have at this time.

There are **two big changes this year**, so please carefully read about these in the packet:

- Instead of our usual Sat-Fri schedule, we are switching to Thu-Wed to accommodate spring breaks of different school districts.
- Most of our registration process is online.

Registration & Important Information

Complete registration includes the following items turned into the Church Office or Drew/Grace Schulz by Sunday, February 4.

Registration Checklist:

- 1. Student Online Registration: https://forms.gle/5o5UwgSmpYSKhMjt6
 - Advisors have a separate registration form, see Advisor packet.
 - Parents/guardians can help with student registration, such as sections on general info and medical info.
 - <u>Students</u> MUST complete the student questionnaire and covenant sections in the online registration.
 - To help us plan logistics, there is a question in the online form to indicate if you A) plan to attend the entire trip (**strongly encouraged**), B) arrive late (fly to San Diego airport) or C) leave early (fly home from San Diego airport). You can only choose <u>one</u> of these options.
- 2. **Parent/Guardian Signatures Print** and sign the last page of this packet and bring it to church.
- 3. **Payment** Bring in a check made out to Trinity Presbyterian Church. Financial assistance is available, see the Online Registration form.
- 4. **Amor Ministries Registration** Every participant must complete this Amor participation form: https://amor.org/participation-form/
 - Search for our group's name Trinity Presbyterian Church, San Carlos.
 - Then select our name and trip dates, Andrew 'Drew' Schulz, 4/5/2024-4/9/2024.
 - *Minors and their legal guardian must sign at the same time so they should be present together when signing. To help mitigate confusion, please see the instructions found here.
- 5. **Immigration (border crossing) form** This will be provided to you prior to our departure.

The student fee for Mexico 2024 is **\$750**. If you need financial assistance, let us know via the Online Registration form.

Passports are required.

No exceptions. No copies. If you don't have one already, or if yours is expired/expiring soon, START the application process NOW! They can take several weeks or even months to get.

NOTE: If your passport expires less than 6 months after the trip dates, we highly recommend renewing your passport.

We will have you bring in your passports and an immigration form when we get closer to the trip. We will provide instructions for you on how to complete the immigration form.

Frequently Asked Questions

What safety measures are being taken for COVID-19?

- We will follow San Mateo County health protocols.
- We recommend that everyone be up to date with current vaccines.
- We will follow all Amor safety protocols (https://amor.org/safety/).

Are the Mandatory Mexico Meetings (MMMs) really mandatory? Why?

 Yes, the meetings are mandatory. The MMMs are the way we bond as a team, provide necessary training, and communicate important info about the trip.

What do we do at the meetings?

• We spend time playing "get-to-know-you" games, singing, hearing a message, talking in small groups, and getting important trip updates. That's a lot to cover in 2 hours, so please BE ON TIME.

Is the Garage Sale fundraiser mandatory? What's my part?

- The Garage Sale is mandatory. However, if you have something very important that day that you cannot get out of, let Drew know as soon as possible BY EMAIL. You will get more information about the sale at the MMM before the event.
- The Garage Sale and student fees pay for trip expenses which include transportation, food, and Amor fees (e.g., registration, construction supplies for the house).

Who assigns the groups (small groups and worksite)?

Mexico leadership team assigns the small groups and all the other assignments.

How much money should I bring on the trip? What's it for?

- You'll need spending money for food and shopping at the extended stop we take on our way back and money for a few fast food meals on the trip (3 lunches and 1 breakfast). Please don't bring an excessive amount of money, \$50-\$60 is enough.
- AMOR also has a store that sells snacks, t-shirts and blankets.

Who picks who gets the houses that we build? What's Amor's involvement?

 AMOR (the organization that organizes our trip) works with local Mexican churches and their pastors. The pastors recommend families that need assistance. We bring the work and love, while AMOR provides overall administration and local support.

How do I contact the mission team while you're away?

 Prior to departure we'll provide information about emergency phone numbers, including the AMOR number. Your cell phones will typically work in Mexico.

What if somebody gets sick or injured? What kinds of safety precautions do you take?

 We have at least one advisor that has first aid and CPR training, and they will take any serious injuries to a hospital in the U.S. We also minimize the possibility of injury or sickness by training the students on safety precautions and providing food and water through a contract food service in Mexico.

What's security like at the campsite?

• AMOR works with local authorities to provide a secure campground. They also have round-the-clock supervision provided. We are very safe!

Who are the advisors?

• The advisor team is a group of adults from the church and community who volunteer to be part of this trip and facilitate the life-changing experience of Trinity's Mexico mission trip for the youth. We are committed to at least a 3 to 1 student/adult ratio (e.g., often 2 to 1).

Fundraiser Participation Commitment

The Mexico Mission Trip is a large success each year thanks to support from both students and parents. These past years have been a testimony to the hard work that our entire community has put forth in making this incredible event happen.

The Trinity Garage Sale is the primary fundraiser for the mission trip and offsets a large portion of what the per-student cost would be without it. Your help is MANDATORY in making it a success!

Parents will be provided with a Sign-Up link to volunteer. Students will sign up for shifts during one of our MMMs.

Prep for the sale will take place Saturday, March 9 through Friday, March 15. The sale itself will be **Saturday, March 16, 8 AM to 3 PM and Sunday, March 17, 11 AM to 3 PM**. The types of jobs available include:

- Set up: Saturday of the week before the sale
- Sorting and organizing from Sunday through Friday
- Helping at the sale Saturday and Sunday
- Cleaning up Sunday after the sale (typically until ~6 PM). WE NEED AS MUCH HELP
 AS POSSIBLE for clean-up!
