Dear All Saints',

Welcome to the month of August! Earlier this summer I highlighted the community event, "Stories at the Cemetery", held one Sunday in June, July and August at the Anchorage Memorial Park Cemetery. I have attended the last two events and there is an upcoming one Sunday, August 10th. These events of learning about the lifestories of former Anchorage residents – some famous, some infamous and many like you and me – has cause me to take time to reflect on the themes of faith and legacy ... not an unimportant exercise for every single person. You see, the question of legacy pierces through the noise of daily life, demanding we pause and consider what truly matters. As Christians, our legacy extends far beyond earthly achievements or material accumulations. It encompasses the love we've shared, the lives we've touched, and the way we've reflected Christ's character in our relationships and actions.

Scripture reminds us that "a good name is more desirable than great riches" (Proverbs 22:1). Our legacy is ultimately not built on grand gestures, but in countless small acts of faithfulness—the encouraging word to a struggling friend, the patience shown to family members, the integrity maintained when no one is watching. Each day presents opportunities to live intentionally, asking ourselves: Will this decision honor God? Will this action reflect His love in the world?

Perhaps no legacy is more precious than the gift of faith passed from one generation to another. Like Timothy, who received the faith through his grandmother Lois and mother Eunice (2 Timothy 1:5), we are called to be faithful stewards of the gospel message, that it might be received and flourish in the hearts of those who come after us. This spiritual inheritance is transmitted through authentic Christian living. Children and young people observe how we handle adversity, how we treat others, and whether our faith sustains us through both valleys and mountaintops. Our prayers, our worship, our service to others—these become the building blocks of faith for the next generation.

In considering legacy, however, we must first acknowledge the Source of all good things. God's faithfulness forms the foundation upon which we build our own faithful living. His provisions—both seen and unseen—have sustained us through every season of life. And, reflecting on God's goodness cultivates gratitude, which transforms our perspective and motivates living for Christ. When we recognize that every blessing flows from His hand, we're inspired to be conduits of that same goodness to others. So, a Christian legacy is not a selfmade monument, but a testimony to God's grace working through the imperfect vessels that we are; yet so loved by God in Christ Jesus.

As we contemplate these themes, may we live with an eternal perspective, understanding that our truest legacy lies not in what we accomplish for ourselves, but in faithfully stewardship of God's love, truth, and grace in this world. Yes, let us live the faith, hope and love we are given in Christ Jesus, that others may know and see him in the gift of this life we have been given. Amen.
