Source:

The instruction is given in the New Testament, specifically in the Gospel of Matthew.

• The Command:

Jesus commanded his followers to "Go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you".

Purpose:

It's essentially Jesus entrusting his mission to the church and its followers.

· Components:

The commission involves three key actions:

- Going: Preaching the gospel to all people.
- **Baptizing:** Welcoming new believers into the Christian faith.
- **Teaching:** Instructing new disciples to follow Jesus' commands.

The Key Elements of the Great Commission

- Go: The command to physically go out into the world.
- Make Disciples: The primary task is to teach and train people to follow and obey Jesus.
- **Baptize:** A symbolic act of a new believer's entry into the Christian faith in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.
- **Teach:** To instruct new believers on how to live out Jesus's commands and grow in their faith.

Its Significance for Christians

Mission of the Church:

The Great Commission defines the Church's purpose and its responsibility to the world.

Witnessing:

It calls believers to be witnesses of Jesus's authority and to demonstrate the Kingdom of Heaven on Earth through their lives.

• Spiritual Growth:

The process of making disciples also helps established believers to grow stronger in their own faith as we teach and support new believers.

• Global Impact:

This mandate encourages the sharing of the Christian message to all peoples and places, ensuring that everyone has the opportunity to hear and respond to the good news.

• Be a Disciple First:

You must be a follower of Jesus yourself, committed to His teachings and growing in your faith.

• Build Authentic Relationships:

Discipleship happens through relationships where truth, love, guidance, and support are shared.

• Live Life-on-Life:

It is a process of spiritual growth that occurs over a lifetime, where believers share life with one another and grow in maturity.

• Empowered by the Holy Spirit:

The process is not about imposing your will but about relying on the power of the Holy Spirit, whom Jesus promised would be with us always.

Model Jesus:

Disciple-makers model their lives after Jesus, showing others how to follow Him.
