In anticipation of Mulberry's upcoming Bicentennial Celebration in 2026, the Leonard Hill Cochran Historical Room presents a moment of Mulberry history:

Report from the Recreational Committee July 26, 1965:

The glorious and carefree days of summer have resulted in quite a bit of activity in the Recreational Department. The full recreational program for Vacation Church School was handled by Mr. Bob Ayers.

A Fun Days program, running from Tuesday – Friday of each week, was participated in by 30 children ranging from 7 to 12 years. Activities included visits to The Forestry Center, industrial plants, and swimming at the YMCA. A program in crafts, puppet shows, and games was also instituted at the Youth Center.

The Family Camping Program, originally set up for July 4th, has been postponed until August 7th and 8th and will be held at Pine Mountain. Nine families have already signed up.

The last big summer event for the Recreational Department will be Youth Activities Week, and elaborate plans are being developed to make this an outstanding occasion.
