

Luke 3:7-18 (Pew Bible pg 834)

John said therefore to the multitudes that came out to be baptized by him, "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come? Bear fruits that befit repentance, and do not begin to say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our father'; for I tell you, God is able from these stones to raise up children to Abraham. Even now the axe is laid to the root of the trees; every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire."

And the multitudes asked him, "What then shall we do?" And he answered them, "He who has two coats, let him share with him who has none; and he who has food, let him do likewise." Tax collectors also came to be baptized, and said to him, "Teacher, what shall we do?" And he said to them, "Collect no more than is appointed you." Soldiers also asked him, "And we, what shall we do?" And he said to them, "Rob no one by violence or by false accusation, and be content with your wages."

A Bicentennial Moment

In anticipation of Mulberry's upcoming Bicentennial Celebration in 2026, the Leonard Hill Cochran Historical Room presents a moment of Mulberry history:

Continued – "125th Anniversary Mulberry Street Methodist Church 1826 – 1926" written by James W. W. Daniel

Before the end of the year (1926) plans had been approved for the construction of new educational plant at a cost of \$250,000. The contract was let in the summer of 1927 and by late fall the work was about ²/₃rd completed and \$126,418.92 paid on it.

During the building/reconstruction period, the pastor lived in a rental house on Orange Street and since the congregation had no home, several other congregations, among them the Jewish and the Mason Temple (on Mulberry) generously offered to share religious facilities until completion of the building program. Some Sunday School classes were held in The Bibb County Court House.

With the completion of the splendid educational building and remodeling inside and out of the church auditorium in the early spring of 1928 there seemed to come a new sense of religious fervor and pride of ownership among the communicants.

In 1929, one of the finest cathedral organs in the Southeast was presented to Mulberry by Mrs. Edith Stetson Coleman, Eugene Stetson, and James Stetson in memory of their mother, Mrs. Eugenia Pate Coleman. (to be continued)
