Now after they had left, an angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and said, "Get up, take the child and his mother, and flee to Egypt, and remain there until I tell you, for Herod is about to search for the child, to destroy him." Then Joseph got up, took the child and his mother by night, and went to Egypt and remained there until the death of Herod. This was to fulfill what had been spoken by the Lord through the prophet, "Out of Egypt I have called my son."

When Herod saw that he had been tricked by the magi, he was infuriated, and he sent and killed all the children in and around Bethlehem who were two years old or under, according to the time that he had learned from the magi. Then what had been spoken through the prophet Jeremiah was fulfilled:

"A voice was heard in Ramah,
wailing and loud lamentation,
Rachel weeping for her children;
she refused to be consoled, because they are no more."

When Herod died, an angel of the Lord suddenly appeared in a dream to Joseph in Egypt and said, "Get up, take the child and his mother, and go to the land of

Israel, for those who were seeking the child's life are dead." Then Joseph got up, took the child and his mother, and went to the land of Israel. But when he heard that Archelaus was ruling Judea in place of his father Herod, he was afraid to go there. And after being warned in a dream, he went away to the district of Galilee. There he made his home in a town called Nazareth, so that what had been spoken through the prophets might be fulfilled, "He will be called a Nazarene."

A Bicentennial Moment

In anticipation of Mulberry's upcoming Bicentennial Celebration in 2026, the Leonard Hill Cochran Historical Room presents a moment of Mulberry history:

**125th Anniversary Mulberry Street Methodist Church
1826 - 1926 written by James W. W. Daniel,
continued**

Sunday, October 17, 1937, a great congregation assembled to celebrate the settlement of the debt and to received The Book of Remembrance, a beautifully bound volume in which are inscribed in Old English script the names of all who made contributions of the payment and also the names of those who contributed to the original 1926 building fund. Finally under the leadership of Dr. Silas Johnson, without encroachment on any of the other financial interests of the church, the moral obligation of the bonded indebtedness [to the original purchasers of Mulberry bonds] was paid in full in 1945.

A day of celebration was set aside for the dedication of the Church School plant for May 20, 1945. And on a tablet in the narthex of the church was the following statement:

‘We have had two objectives in paying this moral obligation: One ‘As ye would that men should do unto you, do ye also to them.’ Two, to fortify the church in the righteousness and undergird her with moral and spiritual rectitude, in order that she may discharge her full duty to God and man.’

Season of Christmas

The season of Christmas begins Christmas Day and continues through the Day of Epiphany. It is a time of praise and thanksgiving for the incarnation of God in Jesus Christ. The paraments in the sanctuary are white to represent the joy and festivities of the season.
