Worship on Palm/Passion Sunday

The events framed by Jesus' entry into Jerusalem and his resurrection are some of the most dramatic and theologically important of the entire scriptural narrative. The first Sunday of Holy Week is commonly called either "Palm Sunday" or "Passion Sunday." "Palm Sunday" tends to focus on the entry of Christ into Jerusalem to shouts of "Hosanna! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord!" (Mark 11:9) "Passion Sunday" focuses on Jesus' suffering. Our combining the two into a single service highlights the irony of the day, the day on which Jesus entered the city in triumph, but as part of his journey to the cross; this is the week in which the crowd's cries of "Hosanna" would soon turn to "Crucify him!" Our worship today begins by focusing on the procession into Jerusalem and then concentrates on the suffering and passion of Jesus as we prepare for the coming days of Holy Week. He continues to compose and arrange music for worship for singers (children, youth, and adult), organ, handbells, instrumental ensembles, and congregations. A graduate of Carthage College, Kenosha, Wisconsin, he earned his M.M. degree from Southern Methodist University and his D.M.A. degree from Arizona State University.

We hope this will be just the first of many visits Dr. Burkhardt will make to Mulberry St. United Methodist Church.
