## **Risk vs. Reason: A Reflection on Joshua**

Joshua is probably best known to us, not because of scripture, but because of the African-American spiritual, “Joshua Fit the Battle of Jericho.” But Joshua did not simply pop into scripture for this one unusual battle. Joshua, who was the successor to Moses as leader of the Israelites, came to that role because he had great faith in God.

Joshua was one of twelve spies Moses sent into Canaan when the Israelites were nearing the Promised Land from Egypt. When the spies returned from exploring the land, they attested that it was a land of great fruitfulness. However, they said the people were huge and powerful. Ten of the spies could only see what was visible to them. Joshua and Caleb, the other two spies, trusted that God, who had promised them this land, would fulfill God’s promise.

Hebrews 11:1 says: *To have faith is to be sure of the things we hope for, to be certain of the things we cannot see.* Joshua was certain of what he could not see. He trusted that God, who brought the Israelites out of Egypt with great power, had not become powerless or untrustworthy.

Voices of “reason” overshadowed voices of faith in God, and the consequence was that the Israelites remained in the desert until all the faithless alive at the time of the spies’ return died; only Joshua and Caleb remained. The short-sighted did not live to see God fulfill God’s promise.

How can we say we have faith in God if we, like the ten spies, only rely on what we can see and measure? By its very definition, faith is not sight. *We live by faith and not by sight. (2 Corinthians 5:7)* When we hoard possessions instead of practicing generosity, we are living by sight. Our cautiousness and desire for security and certainty do not allow room for God to be God for us.

Faith involves risk. Jesus was not cautious and reasonable. He riled the Jewish leaders, knowing the consequences. Lest we excuse ourselves by saying we aren’t God and couldn’t be expected to do what Jesus did, consider the disciples. Faith enabled them to be bold for the sake of the gospel. Christianity spread not by cautiousness but by people who risked everything because they were sure of God’s love and faithfulness, even when discipleship was risky.

Christianity is kept alive not by caution and reasonableness, but bold, confident, risky faith. Do we believe God is trustworthy? Do our lives reflect this belief?

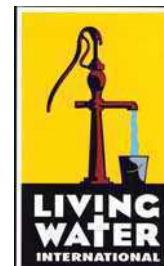
